Chaplain's Reflection Dignity of Women

A passage in St. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians is very troubling to many women because it has been grossly misinterpreted by controlling men, including some husbands and abused wives. In Eph. 5:22, St. Paul explicitly defines the role of wives with these words. "Wives should be subordinate to their husbands as to the Lord" (Eph. 5:22). However, in this passage, Paul did not say that wives are inferior to their husbands in anything.

Treating women as inferior to men is a very grave moral failing of the highest order because a woman is, like her husband, created in the image and likeness of God. Jesus, himself, loved and respected women so much that He included them among his closest disciples at an historical time when women had no status in society. It is notable that the first post-Resurrection appearance of Jesus was to a woman.

Even though our society is frequently obsessed with the idea of a battle of the sexes, God did not create men and women so that they could be in competition with one another. And this dynamic of equality between the sexes does not change upon entering the marriage covenant. The nuptial blessing given at every Catholic wedding says very explicitly: "May her husband entrust his heart to her ...acknowledging her as his equal."

Paul also did not say that wives should be slaves to their husbands. Whether husband or wife, being subordinate or submissive to your spouse is not the same as being their slave. St. Ambrose says this bluntly as he implores the men of his time: "You are not her master, but her husband: she was not given to you to be your slave, but your wife...."

Spousal submission for the good of the other, whether it be the husband or the wife is the cornerstone of any happy and successful marriage. Spouses are not indentured to each other, but rather must make choices for the good of the marriage even when he or she would prefer to do something different. It can be a real leap of faith to allow someone else to make a decision that we do not completely agree with. But, if that decision does not result in an abusive or otherwise adverse situation, someone needs to make a free will decision to submit to the wishes of the other out of love. And this submission

must be freely given, total and cheerful.

Paul also has this very strong admonition for husbands: "Husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself." How does a husband love? In his book *Love and Responsibility*, Pope John Paul II observes that mankind's ability to love someone means to subordinate oneself to another's good.

Pope John Paul II further observes that when two people are pursuing the same common good, not only does this make them equals, it "precludes the possibility that one of them might be subordinated to the other." Thus, the husband should not do anything to the wife that would cause her to "be subordinated."

St. John Chrysostom observed, "You want your wife to obey you as the Church obeys Christ? Then you must care for her as much as Christ cares for the Church. Should it be necessary to die for her, to be cut into a thousand pieces, to bear any sort of suffering, you should not say no."

Yes, St. Paul asks a lot of wives when he instructs them to be submissive to their husbands. But marriage is not a one-way street. In accepting their wives' submission, husbands are to sacrifice everything for the benefit of their wives. Both husband and wife must willingly give up a part of themselves for the benefit of the other, in the efforts to seek a greater good together - eternal life in heaven.
