A MESSAGE FROM OUR CHAPLAIN, REVEREND MARTIN VALLELY

Dear Brothers,

I greet you as the new Fraternal Year gets underway in earnest, and I want to encourage you and your families as you strive to serve the Lord in the months to come! May His blessings strengthen you and give you courage and joy in all your endeavours for His Kingdom!

I have had a practice, in my past Newsletter messages, of choosing a "theme" of sorts for a given fraternal year. And I would like to inaugurate that practice for our Council as well. This year, I would like to spend a bit of time every month speaking about a Saint, particularly Saints who serve as effective role models for men. Most

of these would, predictably, be males, but not necessarily all. It is often said that our age lacks real heroes. If there is perhaps some truth in that, then we as Catholic men need to look to the heroes of our Catholic Tradition for help on our journey.

I choose to begin with someone probably most have at least heard of, but may not know very well. It is Saint Augustine (A.D. 354 - 430), whose Feast Day is August 28th. What you may remember for sure is that Augustine's mother was Monica, who prayed in tears for many years that her wayward son would return to the Faith (Saint Monica is an excellent one for us to pray to if we are worried about any of our family members who have fallen away from the Faith). Augustine drifted from his faith as a young adult, on account of immoral living, to be sure; but also on account of getting caught up in peculiar currents of thought and philosophies which were very attractive, but also devastatingly harmful. One could say that, for a long while, Augustine was too smart for his own good. He actually became a professor, teaching these false philosophies.

African-born, Augustine ended up teaching in Milan, Italy, where he encountered the great Doctor of the Church Saint Ambrose. Partly on account of Ambrose's teaching and counsel, and partly in virtue of a massive internal struggle occasioned by world-weariness, loneliness, and the sense that he had lost all direction and meaning in his life, Augustine allowed God to speak to his soul, and was converted back to the Lord and his Church. Monica's prayers were answered at last! Augustine returned to North Africa after his mother's death, became a priest and a Bishop, and ultimately became one of the greatest teachers and shepherds the Church has ever known. The scope of his influence on Catholic thought and life is immeasurable.

Augustine's greatest contribution, perhaps, is his teaching on the workings of Divine Grace. Do not be thrown off by that expression into thinking that we are speaking of some lofty and dry mental gymnastics which would be of only minimal or no interest to you. Augustine put the immense power of his mind into touch with his own personal experience, to develop a teaching which is thrillingly intimate and personal. He is talking about how God wants to dwell deep within us, to unite us to himself completely. His very life is infused into our souls! Our relationship with God is not to be empty and stale, but to be pulsatingly alive and vigourous. In short, a real man falls hopelessly in love with Jesus Christ. I believe that all Knights of Columbus should be real men who fall hopelessly and unashamedly in love with Jesus Christ. And that love is to be the basis of their eagerness to serve as Knights.

Just to give you a taste of the soaring passion of Augustine's discovery of God, and the life of joy he came so close to losing entirely, I share with you a magnificent passage from his Confessions, a book which essentially tells the story of his conversion.

Late have I loved you, Beauty so ancient and so new, late have I loved you!

Lo, you were within but I outside, seeking there for you, and upon the shapely things you have made I rushed headlong – I, misshapen. You were with me, but I was not with you. They held me back far from you, those things which would have no being, were they not in you.

You called, shouted, broke through my deafness; you flared, blazed, banished my blindness; you lavished your fragrance, I gasped; and now I pant for you; I tasted you, and now I hunger and thirst; you touched me, and I burned for your peace.

God's blessings upon us all in this new Fraternal Year!






Reminders of other K of C Councils activities

Council Audit

Just to ensure all of our members appreciate some of the things that go on in the background I thought I would give our Council Audit team a little recognition. Twice a year we are required by Knights of Columbus rules to do a complete audit of the council's finances. This involves reviewing all receipts and disbursements to ensure that they have all properly cleared the bank and are consistent with the bank records.

The bulk of the work falls to our Financial Secretary Vic Lefebvre and Treasurer Ron Lehocki. They are responsible for summarizing and compiling all of the documents and bank records so the audit team made up of the 3 Council Trustees (Brothers Aeneas Mac Isaac, Joe Baumgartner and Willie Joki) and the Grand Knight can review them and verify that they are in order. Once the audit team has approved and verified the transactions a report is prepared, signed by the audit committee and was forwarded to the Supreme Council by Brother Vic on August 9, 2017 with copies to the State Deputy and District Deputy.
