*Note: Venerable Servant of God Father Michael McGivney would not be the first member of the Knights of Columbus to be canonized. A group of six Mexican members of our organization were martyred during the Cristero War of 1926-1929 and its aftermath. The six are St. Luis Batis, St. Rodrigo Aguilar, St. Miguel de la Mora, St. Pedro de Jesús Maldonado, St. José María Robles, and St. Mateo Correa.
