Dad Coaches Needed at STPCC

"In Service to one, In Service to all."

That is the motto of the Knights of Columbus. As Knights, we are called to live in His image and be of service to everyone. Putting others needs above our own. Especially now, it is even more important that we try and fulfill that duty. Once again, God is giving us that opportunity.

Sarah Anderson, from South Texas Pregnancy Care Center, reached out and explained that they are looking for volunteers to become Dad coaches. Please take the time to read the letter she sent to me, explaining what the position entails and let's see if we can get some Brother Knights to help out.

Jericho,

Thank you for the opportunity to reach out to the Knights of Columbus Council 3412! I know our local council is full of wonderful men who can help with this need. I am reaching out because I know that the Knights have been faithful supporters of the South Texas Pregnancy Care Center through the years and I believe that this is a wonderful way for Council 3412 to help.

In my work at the South Texas Pregnancy Care Center, I am able to see young mothers and fathers come to the center for support. Due to many unforeseen events this year, mostly related to the Covid-19 Pandemic, our center is in critical need of volunteers, especially dads. It breaks my heart to see a father come to an appointment and we do not have a Dad Coach to meet with him. As I was thinking about this problem, I realized that our KC Council and our two Catholic Churches here in town have the solution to this problem. There are many men among you who could fill this void.

God appoints each father as the head of his own household. This includes enormous responsibility and great privilege. God has uniquely equipped men to provide for their families and protect them from harm, both physically and spiritually.

At the South Texas Pregnancy Care Center (STPCC), dads are included every step of the way. Dad Coaches have an opportunity to speak into the lives of young dads, walking beside them as they begin fatherhood, sharing wisdom gained from the years of their own experience as fathers and husbands.

Dad coaches are asked to commit to one 3-hour shift per week. Once a week, there is even a late afternoon shift that begins at 4pm. They will receive 6 hours of training on how to work with clients at STPCC. They will then go through a shadowing process, observing others as they work with clients until they are ready to begin independent coaching. Coaching is based on an extensive collection of video lessons, many designed just for dads. STPCC has a need for 8 Dad Coaches per week. Please consider joining us as a Dad Coach.

Whether you are bidding online or in the Handbid app, here are some easy tips to help:

- MAX BID: This is the maximum amount you are willing to spend for an item and the Handbid system will automatically bid for you until you reach your max. Set a max bid and enjoy your day!
- NOTIFICATIONS: If you have downloaded the Handbid app and accepted push notifications, you will be notified when you are outbid on an item. If you don't accept push notifications, you will receive text messages from Handbid.
- DASHBOARD: Monitor what you are currently winning and losing on the dashboard screen in your app or online.

Field Agent's Report

Why do Americans forget to insure their paychecks? Because they usually believe one of these disability insurance myths:



Schedule

9:00 to 10:30: Registration and optional individual photos (PMC)

10:30: Candidates assemble for group photo (breezeway between church and parish hall)

11:00 to 1:00: Exemplification ceremony (hall)

1:00: New SKs receive any photos that were purchased (Parish hall)

Exemplification Fee

Exemplification fee is \$50, except for priests for whom it is \$20. "No show" candidates (less than 5-day notice) other than priests will be assessed \$25.

Official Dress for the Day for Candidates

Black, dark blue or dark gray business suit with white shirt, dark tie, dark socks, and black shoes. *No boots. No sport coats. No button-down collars. No ruffles.* Black tuxedo with plain white shirt and black bow tie and cummerbund is also acceptable.
