







I received an email about "Laying the Cornerstone of the Domestic Church." The Knights of Columbus have been focused on building the domestic church, and this element is designed particularly for facilitating family prayer and teaching this discipline to children. This initiative is welcome at a time of particular challenges from our culture against a Catholic understanding of family.

September is a fitting month for such an initiative. The days grow shorter. The history of the Church and European history have been so intertwined that we find many of the feast days closely connected to natural events in the northern hemisphere. As days grow darker, the Church focuses on images of spiritual light. Following closely the autumnal equinox, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Archangels.

Traditionally, this Mass focused on Michael and was known as Michaelmas. Before time began, the devil and other angels broke up the original community of the court of heaven. Satan had to have things his way. Michael and other angels put down the rebellion, but Satan continues to act powerfully in God's creation. The prayer to St. Michael seeks his help to cast into hell evil spirits who "seek the ruin of souls."

The present understanding of freedom in our culture leads to ruin of souls. Children who are reared without discipline in the end can't exercise free will because they have become enslaved by having to have things their way. They can't sacrifice pleasure for the sake of choosing the greater good. I encourage families to teach their children the St. Michael prayer. Evil is real; and, if a child is not taught that evil is real, that child will be ill-equipped to deal with evil.

St. Patrick Catholic school will celebrate a Blue Mass for the police department, the fire department, military personnel, first responders, and other emergency personnel on the Feast of the Archangels – September 29. Brother Knights,

Our seminarian convocation in Chatawa was a big success. I believe that we were able to come together as brothers and learn from each other in a very fruitful way. I appreciate your prayers and support, not just of me, but of all of the seminarians studying for the priesthood in the Diocese of Jackson. The retreat was short, but in two days we spent time praying before the Blessed Sacrament, grilling together, speaking with one another in formal and informal settings, and getting to know the School Sisters of Notre Dame in Chatawa.

I am now going full speed into another academic year. This is my second-to-last year in the seminary and there has definitely been a shift in my classes. Instead of studying broad concepts and far-reaching theories, many of my classes this year have to do with very practical needs and skills that I will have to have when I go to a parish. My classes include studying the canons regarding marriage in the Code of Canon Law so I can help with marriage prep and guide parishioners through the annulment process along with a course on the letters of St. Paul.

After one class, however, I have already been convinced that I need to fall in love with Paul. After all, Paul gives us an example of how pastors operated *right after* Christ's death and resurrection. Many of his letters are addressed to communities that he was ministering to, and so if I don't know Paul, then I am missing out on a priceless example of a pastor.

My other duty this year is to help with the Apostolic outreach of Notre Dame Seminary. I am working to develop programs that help our seminarians care for the needy in New Orleans, and also to care for our own community through prayer and outreach. I continue to be humbled by your support, and I look forward to seeing you all soon!

First, I did not expect to still be writing a Newsletter article in the Church Program corner after I announced my intention of stepping down earlier this month. So, what am I doing here? Don't ask, all I know is that I was told that I did not go through the proper chain of command (a joke) therefore my request is pending.

Having said that, let us proceed, just read on and try to keep up with our upcoming Church program activities.

Sept. 11 ----- Anniversary of 9/11, it is also the designated <u>International World Day of Prayer for P E A C E.</u>
Sept. 18 ----- Our Lady Of Guadalupe Silver Rose — (Originally scheduled to be on Sept. 11) There will be a special prayer service at St. Joseph immediately following the 3:00 pm. Spanish Mass with special presentation along with an Honor Guard.

So, just what is Our Lady Of Guadalupe Silver Rose all about...

Beginning in March 2016, six Silver Roses began their journey across North America, from Canada to the United States to Mexico. The 2016 Our Lady of Guadalupe Silver Rose - One Life, One Rose Program will conclude on December 12, 2016 on the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas, at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey, Mexico.

2016 marks the 56th year of the program which began in 1960 to honor the Blessed Virgin under her title of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas. The program has continued since then as a project of councils and Fourth Degree Assemblies in several jurisdictions. In 2001, Supreme Knight Carl Anderson expanded the program by beginning the "Running of the Rose" from the 119th Annual Meeting of the Supreme Council in Toronto. This is "a perfect program for the Knights of Columbus," said Supreme Knight Anderson. "Through it we honor not only Our Lady of Guadalupe and express the unity of the Order, but we also reaffirm the Order's dedication to the sanctity of human life. It is to the Blessed Mother that we turn in prayer as we work to end the Culture of Death that grips our society. As we think in terms of 'One Life, One Rose,' it is most appropriate that we turn to Our Lady of Guadalupe who made known her will through Juan Diego and the miracle of the roses."

Today six Silver Roses travel throughout North America exemplifying Knights of Columbus devotion to Our Lady and commitment to the Culture of Life. This year, one rose begins in Alberta and heads west to British Columbia before heading south along the Pacific coast and turning east on a winding path through the southwest and mountain states before reaching Texas. A second rose starts in Saskatchewan and heads south entering the United States in Montana and travelling through the northern US Rockies and the Great Plains on its way toward Texas. A third rose starts its run in Manitoba, moving south through the central United States and along the Mississippi before turning to Texas. A fourth Rose begins its journey in Ontario moving through the Midwest and some of the Mid-Atlantic States before ending in Washington, D.C. A fifth Rose begins in Virginia and journeys throughout the south on its way to Texas. A sixth Rose starts in Maine and travels throughout the northeast, completing its journey in Connecticut. The program ends on December 12, 2016, which is the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

I hope this gives you a better understanding of this year's Silver Rose Program.

Brother Knights,

Southern Louisiana was hit by what is called "the worst natural disaster since super storm Sandy." Please keep these families in your prayers as they seek to recover from the loss of lives, homes, business and their way of life.

Several people have died, with thousands forced from their homes. More than 30,000 people have been rescued from the flooded areas, many seeking refuge in emergency shelters.

In response to the devastation, the Supreme Council has launched an online donation drive to assist with local relief operations. One hundred percent of the proceeds will go directly to relief efforts.

The Knights of Columbus has a long tradition of providing disaster relief, said Supreme Knight Carl Anderson. Our communities, like the people of Southern Louisiana, need our time, our efforts and our financial assistance. We are going to do all that we can, working with the Louisiana State Council and local councils, to help those most in need as a result of the flooding. Your support is urgently needed. Please DONATE TODAY to help those who are suffering.

Two years ago, three national pro-life groups announced the first "National Day of Remembrance for Aborted Children" to honor the unborn at the grave sites where they are buried. Although there is no such grave site in Mississippi, Pro-Life Mississippi will once again sponsor a memorial service to mourn the lives of the thousands of Mississippi babies killed by legalized abortion since 1973. This event will take place on Saturday, September 10, at 12:30 p. m. at the corner of Mississippi Street and North President Street in downtown Jackson.

"We chose this site because it was used by the Mississippi Baptist Convention Board to collect 50 million pennies to fund an endowment for pro-life causes in Mississippi," stated PLM president Judy Batson. The pennies were placed in a glass case called the "Memorial to the Missing" and represented the grim reality of the 50 million babies killed by legalized abortion from 1973 through 2005.

The memorial has since been replaced by a square with a plaque in the center that reads: If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land. 2 Chronicles 7:14

"Our memorial service will be led this year by Pastor Richard Morgan of Koinonia Baptist Church," continued Batson. "Please come join us as we honor our missing Mississippi babies."

The next 40 Days for Life campaigns are about to be held simultaneously in ALL 50 American states ... for the first time ever! You also helped set the stage for this next 40 Days for Life campaign to be the largest united pro-life mobilization in history!

As of now, 342 cities -- across all 50 states and 24 nations -- have already been approved to conduct local campaigns from September 28 through November 6. That is 26 more cities than the previous largest 40 Days for Life ... and there are still more to be approved.

Here in the United States these UNITED 40 Days for Life campaign **will cover nearly half** of all remaining abortion centers with prayer and fasting, peaceful vigils, and grassroots outreach -- the most ever.

"Pro-Life Mississippi has sponsored two 40 Days for Life campaigns a year, in the spring and fall, for over 7 years," said vigil coordinator and PLM President Judy Batson. "We have seen the fruit of this focused prayer and presence at Mississippi's only remaining abortion clinic. We have confirmed dozens of moms and babies saved from abortion each time we engage in this effort."

The Fall 2016 campaign will officially begin on Wednesday, September 28th, at noon with an opening ceremony on the sidewalk at the Jackson Women's Health Organization abortion clinic, located at 2903 North State Street in Jackson. This event typically lasts an hour, fitting into most lunch schedules. There will be a closing event at the same location to end the 40 Days for Life campaign on Sunday, November 6th at 2:00 p. m.

"If you have taken part in one of the past 40 Days for Life prayer vigils, we invite you to join us again," said Duran. "If you have not taken part in 40 Days for Life, but God has put it on your heart to do something to help end abortion, this would be your best way to get started. We ask people to sign up for one hour during any of the 40 days to come out to the sidewalk at the abortion clinic in Jackson and pray. We encourage you to ask church members, friends and family to join you for that hour. We know just the mere presence of praying people on the sidewalk save the lives of babies and mothers from abortion."

If you have never been out to the sidewalk at the abortion clinic before, you may call the PLM office to arrange for one of our seasoned volunteers to meet you there. Phone: 601-956-8636
