RETIREES CLUB

The National Labor Day Holiday was created by Congress in 1894, but this was preceded by many states that started a "working man's holiday" and held parades and picnics as a tribute to the contributions all workers made to the well-being of our country. The first parade was held in New York City in 1882 and the holiday was promoted by labor unions across the country.

How well do your grandchildren know you? What do they know about your own grandparents? Has anyone told them the history of your family? Genealogy is the history of a family descending from their ancestors. Of course, it can extend back in time for many generations. If you are among the eldest in your family it would prove beneficial to everyone if you could draw up a generational chart going back through as many relatives as possible. Additionally, if you could provide details and relevant information on individuals it would be appreciated by everyone in your family.

Since we were all immigrants to this country at some time in the past, you may find it helpful to consult Ancestry.com. Have you ever visited Ellis Island in New York City? It is located next to the Statue of Liberty just a short ferry ride from Manhattan. You may consult with www.mps.gov/ellis or www.archives.gov/nyc. Both the Customs and Immigration offices collected records of every immigrant to the U.S.: nationality, place of birth, ship's name and home port, date of U.S. entry and the name of a U.S. relative. Census records are another source of information available to you.

This is September and all the children are back in school. If you live in a parish that supports an elementary school, please make an effort to contribute to its future. It is very difficult for parents alone to support a good Catholic education for our young ones. Ask your pastor what you can do to assist in maintaining our Catholic Schools.
