## Chaplain's Message

### “Stations of the Resurrection?”

Brother Knights:

No, it is not a misprint. And no, I am not reproducing this from last year's article because I could not come up with something else. I believe that this message is worth repeating as we embark on this year's celebration of Eternal Life!

This message is about the *Stations of the Resurrection*. We are all familiar of course with the *Stations of the Cross*; we pray them during Lent and perhaps throughout the year.

For those who are not familiar with the *Stations of the Resurrection*, they too are a part of the ancient tradition of the Church. They are actually called: the *Via Lucis* or the *Way of Light*. They parallel the *Stations of the Cross* and they focus upon the Resurrection appearances and faith encounters with the Risen Lord. Perhaps our fifty-day celebration of Easter could be greatly enhanced if we took a little time each day during the Easter Season to meditate upon them.

#### **The Stations of the Resurrection**

1. Jesus Rises from the Dead
2. The Disciples Discover the Empty Tomb
3. The Risen Lord Appears to Mary Magdalen
4. The Risen Lord Appears on the Road to Emmaus
5. The Risen Lord is Recognized in the Breaking of the Bread
6. The Risen Lord Appears to the

Community of Disciples

7. The Risen Lord Breathes Peace and Gives the Power to Forgive
8. The Risen Lord Strengthens the Faith of Thomas
9. The Risen Lord Eats with the Disciples on the Shore of Tiberias
10. The Risen Lord Forgives Peter and Entrusts Him to Tend and Feed His Sheep
11. The Risen Lord Sends the Disciples into the World
12. The Risen Lord Ascends into Heaven
13. Mary and the Disciples Keep Vigil in the Upper Room for the Spirit's Advent
14. The Risen Lord Sends the Holy Spirit

As we walked with Jesus on the way of the Cross during Lent, so now may we walk with Him on the way of Light as we celebrate these Fifty Days of Easter. In doing so, may we experience the same joy and happiness of the Risen Lord as did his mother and our patroness—Mary, Star of the Sea.
