


Welcome to our new Supreme Knight – Patrick Kelly.

candy from a socially acceptable distance to those few trick or treaters who braved the night. Thanksgiving traditions of large family gatherings were taboo and Christmas was so much smaller in 2020. Joyously we experienced the beatification of Blessed Michael McGivney.

Now I hope we are starting to come full circle into 2021. The vaccine is on the way. Some of you have already received it. It looks like there is a light on at the end of the tunnel.

I am most thankful to all of you. Many of you met with me this year and wanted to make sure your desire for financial security was up to date. It was my pleasure to take the time to analyze your situation and give you my recommendations. I look forward to meeting with many more of you in the months ahead whether virtually or face to face. Take this time to pull out existing coverage from the Knights of Columbus or any company for that matter. Brush or blow the dust off them and review them to make sure what you thought you had is still what you actually have today. They say the mind is a funny thing, I know I do not remember what I ate for breakfast two days ago so how are you sure about a policy, coverage, or retirement you did more than one, two, or more than five years ago. My family looks forward to the birth of our new child sometime in the next few days.

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
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
