

## Chaplain's Message

#### Be Merciful: Bear Wrongs Patiently and Shelter the Homeless

Brother Knights:

As I am mentioned in my previous articles, the Church depends very much on organizations such as ours to be on the "front lines" of demonstrating and witnessing to the Catholic faith. This is especially true of the Works of Mercy. The Knights of Columbus can and must always demonstrate these both as individuals within the community and as a Catholic fraternal organization. Thus far, I have reflected on the first four Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy.

The fifth Spiritual Work of Mercy is to bear wrongs patiently. The call to this particular work of mercy is something that everyone experiences to one degree or another as we go through our earthly pilgrimage. Let's face it, people hurt us. From time to time we have all felt the consequences of another's thoughtlessness or carelessness. As a result, at times we find ourselves having to suffer inconveniences which perhaps in justice another should bear. It happens. It is part of the fallen human condition and the imperfection that is concomitant to it. There are times of course when fraternal correction is in order, but more often

than not, we find ourselves having to bear it. This however is an opportunity for grace because it gives us a share in the cross of Christ. After all, Jesus suffered for ALL of us and He was innocent. Could there be any clearer example?

The fifth Corporal Work of Mercy is to shelter the homeless. Everyone needs shelter. Some people live in cardboard homes; some people live in homes made of discarded materials; many people are simply homeless and live wherever they happen to be sitting, standing, or lying at a given moment. To help the homeless obtain shelter is not only an act of mercy but also an act of love. Like the other works of mercy, there is both a strict and wide sense of how we can practice this one.

Sheltering the homeless when taken in the wider sense, extends into areas of neighborly and charitable hospitality. Helping a single parent, a widow, or an elderly person do some repairs on their house is a very good example. Taking the time to talk to the neighbors and being good listeners are also part of this work of mercy. Greeting new people in the neighborhood and welcoming strangers too are examples of this work of mercy, as is materially or financially supporting missionary activity that includes making shelter for the homeless.

From these works of mercy, we as Catholic Christian men and as Brother Knights, can grow stronger in our love of others and participate in a unique way in both the mercy and the suffering of our Lord, as did His mother—Mary, the Star of the Sea.

In 1882, when Father McGivney began our organization, his primary concern was the care of widows and orphans. Even though 130 years have passed, we should never forget his mission. Last month we talked about widow benefit. This month it's a benefit that most don't think about.

As you can imagine, we gets lots of correspondence at the Supreme Council Office, but every now and then a letter or email stands out from the rest. That is what happened when the widow of a member wrote us.

While the name of the person writing has been changed to protect her privacy, the letter appears nearly word for word. This is what she said:

Dear Supreme Knight,

When my husband became a Knight, we were introduced to our insurance agent, Mike Walther. We could sense right away that he thought of his career as more of a 'ministry' than a sales position. Little did I know then how much his sense of ministry would mean to me.

During our meetings, we weren't easy to persuade. Never willing to give up, Mike worked to show us that we had a need, and he was able to help us understand the value of being protected with life insurance.

My husband died suddenly last fall. His death was a shock to everyone. Although from a medical standpoint it shouldn't have happened, I guess God felt his work on Earth was done. Mike was there for me immediately. He was at the wake and the funeral, and then stayed by my side and helped with whatever I needed. He cried for my husband just like I did

I think that in this world where everyone is focused on the bottom line, I saw what the Knights are truly about. They were there for me when I needed them the most.
