Chaplain's Message

Greetings to all my Brother Knights and your families! I pray that this month be a blessed one for you and yours. These words of Pope John Paul II are taken from a conference he gave in Poland back in 1993: "With an act of wholehearted and steadfast faith, renew your fidelity in Jesus Christ, the Savior of the world, and make His Gospel the guide of your thoughts and life. In this way, you will be today's society that yeast of new life which humanity needs in order to build a more just and fraternal future, a future that is open to the civilization of love." Our Holy Father gives us some wonderful food for thought in these brief words. Nevertheless, how do we renew our fidelity and our faithfulness to Christ each day, with the gospel as our guide? Once again, good things come in threes.

I believe we renew fidelity in three ways: first, by the relationships of our lives; second, by the need to find Christ in our suffering; and third, by our need to be reconciled to God and each other. For Francis of Assisi, the greatest gift he gave someone was entering into a relationship with them. In our relations with each other, we find wholeness, commitment, and love. First and foremost, it is a matter of relationship, and then of teaching and preaching. For, in our relationships, we attempt to wear others' shoes, walk on their street, and experience what they experience.

In this way, we renew our faith in Christ, and in each other. We also renew our faith through our experiences of suffering and our willingness to walk with others in their moments of pain. Human suffering can be difficult and challenging. It can leave us helpless, vulnerable, and even angry. However, without suffering, we would never really understand why Jesus did what He did for us. Jesus desired to enter more deeply into our human experience. This would have been enough to show His love for us; but then; He also redeemed and freed us from our sins. This is why we need to be people who seek reconciliation in our lives. God is always ready to forgive us. He only waits for us to ask and confess. Therefore, we need the sacrament of reconciliation.

During this season of Advent, what a great time for us to deepen our relationship with God and go to confession. My Brother Knights, relationships, suffering, and reconciliation are the keys to renewing our fidelity to God, and keeping the gospel as the primary means to personal and spiritual growth. I pray that these thoughts will encourage us to make the best our Advent, and keep Christ in our hearts throughout the Christmas season. In closing, please continue to pray for all who are in need. If I can ever be of help to you in your spiritual journey, or if you or a loved one is in the hospital, please feel free to call me anytime Wishing all of you a blessed month and encourage all of you to keep Christ in in Christmas. 
