Greetings and peace to all my Brother Knights and your families; Happy New Year to you all! Please keep me and all my Franciscan Brothers and Sisters in your prayers this year, as we strive each day to be faithful to our vowed life and the Holy Gospel. I love these words from Edith Stein: "I have an ever deeper and firmer belief that nothing is merely an accident, when seen in the light of God. My whole life, down to the smallest detail, has been marked out for me in the plan of Divine Providence, and has a completely coherent meaning in God's all-seeing eyes." Our Holy Father John Paul II said it this way: "In the work of Divine Revelation, there are no coincidences." My brothers, if we truly believe these words, then we are able to acknowledge each day that our God is with us, and we are in need of His presence. If we embrace these words, we are living the virtue of humility. Do we see God's presence in the daily moments of our lives? trol. Each day in the hospital, I'm

with people whose lives are quickly changed by physical illness. But I suppose, as the saying goes: "You don't fully realize something, until it happens to you." God humbled me that day, and reminded me of my ongoing need for Him.

Now, it's up to me to recognize that need for God each day. What is God trying to teach you, at this point in your life? What has God been trying to teach you in this past year, about yourself and your relationship to Him? These are good questions to take to our daily prayer throughout the new year. My brothers, humbly open your heart to God's presence in this new year, and allow God to work through you in ways that you could never imagine for yourself. Then, you will continue the good work God has begun in you. Finally, please know that my prayers and thoughts are with you. Please keep me in yours.
