### **Chaplain's Message**

# July: The Month of the Most Precious Blood

During the month of July, the Church has traditionally asked us to focus more intently on a very central and significant element of our Catholic faith—the Most Precious Blood of Jesus Christ. This focus is intended to fortify and strengthen our belief in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist and the benefits of our Lord's shedding His blood for us. Accordingly, there are several ways that we can make this focus a fruitful one.

First of all, we can pray the Litany of the Most Precious Blood. Like all litanies, this enables us to peer through the mystery of this wonderful sign of sanctification and see in it the means of our nourishment, the quenching of our spiritual thirst for righteousness, reconciliation, and salvation.

A prayerful reading of the passages of Sacred Scripture that speak of the Precious Blood is another wonderful way to increase our sense of appreciation and longing for the benefits its reception afford us. These references of course, may be found in the institution narratives as well as the passion narratives that recount the institution of the Holy Eucharist by our Lord and His suffering and death, respectively.

We can also benefit from deep soul searching of the manner in which we receive the Precious Blood at Mass; contemplating the graces it imparts, thanking our Lord for this most precious Sacrament, and being more aware of and sensitive to the manner in which we receive it.

Most especially, we discover the immense value of the gift of the Most Precious Blood in our own lives when we pray that others in the community of faith who are not able to receive it or have chosen over a long period time not do so, will be led back by God's grace to being able to benefit from its reception.

As we honor the mystery and the gift of the Most Precious Blood this month, may we be assisted in doing so by the mother of the one who has shed it, and through her intercession, be drawn to its endless grace and mercy—Mary, His mother and Star of the Sea.
