St. John the Baptist was born in Judea six months before Jesus. He was the son of temple priest Zacharias and Elizabeth, who was a cousin of Mary, the mother of Jesus.

John was a Nazarite from birth and prepared for his mission (preaching) by years of self-discipline in the desert wearing a garment made of camel's hair, and eating locusts and wild honey. At about the age of 30 he went into the country around the Jordan river preaching penance to prepare for the coming of the Messiah. He baptized repentful sinners with "living water" as a symbol of the baptism of the Holy Spirit that was yet to come. John himself baptized Christ and recognized him as the Messiah when he saw the spirit come down upon him. His mission as a prophet was accomplished, and his ministry came to a close soon afterward. When King Herod Antipas executed him by use of beheading.

Later Christ praised him, saying that there were none among the sons of women who had arisen greater than him; "yet the least in kingdom of heaven is greater than he."

Finally, since St. John the Baptist is a spiritual part of all of the repentful written prayers for Christians to use when speaking to God, let us all strongly try and remember him and his help he will give to God for us in our prayers when we are in repentance to ask for God's forgiveness.
