Chaplain's Message

"The 40 Cans for 40 Days Project

Brother Knights:

Hopefully we have come to understand Lent as the time when we must practice self-denial, Fast, pray more, be more conscious of and responsive to the needs of the poor and less fortunate, etc.

The reason for all of these things of course is so that we can see our faults and sins more readily, become reconciled to Christ more fully, and thereby heighten our longing for and celebration of the great Season of Easter and all that it promises.

Usually, however, we compartmentalize our observance of Lent; "I am going to give up...I am going to donate to or help with... I am going to try to do a better job..." If we take a moment to "think outside the box" we can undertake or engage in activities during Lent that help us with many of the areas of focus at the same time. There is no greater example of such an activity than the Knights of Columbus' project "40 Cans for 40 Days."

What a wonderful way to bring together the many areas of focus that should be a part of our Lenten Season. In this initiative, Brother Knights are asked to celebrate Lent in a way that is at one and the same time sacrificial, prayerful, and mindful of the poor and the need to give alms.

Each day the Knight (and anyone else who would be able to join him) is asked to stop, think of a person in need, obtain out of pocket a non-perishable food item, place it aside, and say a prayer for the poor and those in need. When done over the Lenten Season, the person would have denied himself, prayed for others, given alms, and grown closer to Christ 40 times.

In this project, the participant practices self-denial, prayer, almsgiving, and charity in the same act. When the Sacrament of Reconciliation is added to this and perhaps other devotional practices, it makes for a very fruitful Lent.

I urge all of my Brother Knights to give serious consideration and prayer to making the "40 Cans for 40 Days" the central part of your Lenten self-denial, prayer, and alms. As you do so, remember to commend the plight of the poor and less fortunate to the love of Christ and Mary, our mother and Star of the Sea.
