#### Chaplain's Message

Greetings to all my Brother Knights and your families, and a Happy May to each of you. In this blessed month of Mary, our mother and queen, I would ask that you pray the Holy Rosary each week in her honor, for any personal intentions or special needs for your families and friends. The call to holiness is a call to prayer, and as brother knights, our devotion to Mary is intimate and ongoing. Speaking of holiness, this has been our vocation and challenge, in these days of Lent and Easter.

Our Easter season may end this month, but the call to personal and communal holiness never ends. It is a call that involves four important aspects. The first is learning and knowledge. We will not persevere in our Catholic faith, if we do not study our history and traditions. For example, do we know the names of the twelve Apostles, the corporal and spiritual works of mercy, the gifts of the Holy Spirit, or the life of our patron saint? Do we read the Catholic Register, and other spiritual resources?
