November is election month, just in case you have been hiding under a rock for the past year! Let us pray God will guide us in making the right choices for our elected leaders.



They will be made on the 19th and delivered on the 20th.





As Thanksgiving approaches at the end of November, I like to take stock of all the things I'm thankful for.


