"We're All Missionaries"

Brother Knights:

This year, October 23rd is World Mission Sunday. World Mission Sunday is a day set aside for the Church throughout the world to publicly renew its commitment to the missionary movement. It is celebrated on the fourth Sunday of October every year. It was created by Pope Pius XI in 1926 as the day of prayer and propaganda of missions.

In short, it was to instill and renew each year a missionary spirit in the minds and hearts of both the clergy and the faithful throughout the universal Church.
