

Chaplain's Message

Be Merciful: Pray for the Living and the Dead and Bury the Dead

Brother Knights:

As I am mentioned in my previous articles, the Church depends very much on organizations such as ours to be on the "front lines" of demonstrating and witnessing to the Catholic faith. This is especially true of the Works of Mercy. The Knights of Columbus can and must always demonstrate these both as individuals within the community and as a Catholic fraternal organization. Thus far, I have reflected on the first six Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy.

The seventh Spiritual Work of Mercy is to pray for the living and the dead. In short, this work of mercy is teaching us to pray for everyone. As sharers in the communion of saints, we have the obligation to do precisely that. Prayer as a work of mercy is a means of spreading the fires of charity as well as mercy to others when they are offered for the living. We can be ambassadors of God's mercy when we pray for those who may hate us or may have treated us wrongly. Praying for those who have extended their love to us such as parents, friends, benefactors, and loved ones is a way of not only thanking God, but returning their love by commending them to God's love and protection. Praying for the sick, the suffering, and the dying is the most powerful and effective means we have to assist others whom we would otherwise feel powerless to help. In such circumstances, we become instruments of hope, comfort, and perhaps healing.

Praying for the dead is no less effective. Many wonder what good we could possibly do for the faithful departed once they have left this world. The answer is: plenty. Our prayers assist those in purgatory. These individuals can and do have their time in purgatory lessened and their release hastened because of the prayers and good works we do on their behalf. Next month (November) is dedicated by the Church specifically to this intention. Our prayers for the faithful departed are given the greatest focus on All Souls Day (November 2.) On this day all the faithful departed are prayed for, including those whom we do not even know; especially if they have no one else to pray for them. They have a spiritual poverty in that no one is praying for them; hence, the term "poor souls in purgatory."

The seventh Corporal Work of Mercy is to bury the dead. As a work of mercy, this of course applies to the totality of Christian burial. Participating in Masses of Christian burial and acts of charity for the spouse and family members of the deceased is part of wider sense in which this work of mercy is to be understood and performed. The body of a Christian has been sanctified by baptism and the other sacraments. It is something special and holy and should be treated as such. Accordingly, we perform this act of mercy by doing things like volunteering our time in caring for a cemetery or perhaps accompanying loved ones as they visit the grave of a loved one. Likewise, being a part of bereavement support groups is another excellent way to perform this work of mercy.

The greatest example and assistance available to us who seek to perform these works of mercy is the one who took us in her care at the foot of the cross, continues to intercede on behalf of the living and the dead, and buried her very own son—Mary, Star of the Sea.
