Chaplain's Message

Greetings and peace to my Brother Knights and your families, and a Happy September to you all. As we remember our students and teachers returning to school this month, let us also remember the families who lost loved ones on September 11, 2001. Because of that day, our country and its citizens are changed forever. With all the hope of new beginnings that the month of September brings, it also brings back painful memories. More than ever, we hunger for the God who gives us hope, and who comforts us in our sadness.

But, how do we seek to satisfy that hunger? As Catholics, it is always through prayer and the sacraments. Within that prayer, I would suggest in this month of solemn memories, that we take time for personal meditation. In addition to reading Sacred Scripture, praying the rosary, and spontaneous prayer etc., we should take a few moments each day to be quiet with God. It seems that the longer I strive to live religious life, the more difficult it is to keep distractions away. As I lay quiet, I'm thinking about tasks I have to complete, people I need to talk to, and music on the radio. At these times. I find it helpful to recite the "Jesus Prayer." Each time a distraction comes, I simply pray: "Lord Jesus Christ, have mercy on me, a sinner!", until the distraction goes away.

I find meditation very helpful, because it affirms my hunger for God; and for me, it is the most challenging of my prayers. One important note: I never meditate for more than 10-15 minutes a day. Usually, I will meditate in the early evening, because that is the time when I am most alert. Whatever time works best for you, I would suggest that you explore the possibility of meditation for yourselves. Last month, the Franciscans celebrated the feast of Saint Clare on August 11. Saint Clare treasured meditative prayer in her own life. Therefore, I close this article with her precious words to Agnes of Prague:

"As you meditate, you behold the poverty of Him who was laid in a manger and wrapped in swaddling clothes. What wondrous humility and astonishing poverty!

Continuing your meditation, you realize the sufferings He endured to redeem the human race. Finally, you discern the ineffable love which made Him willing to die a most shameful death on the cross."

Through meditation, we will realize this love even more, and will ultimately realize the depth of our own love for Him. It is this love that will strengthen us and our world each day, as we strive to persevere after tragedies like 9/11. God's blessings to each of you this month, especially to our students and teachers, and God's blessings of comfort and strength for all who mourn. I look forward to seeing each of you real soon, and until then, I am:
