

Chaplain's Message

Brother Knights:

When we think about the role models of the life we live and the work we do as Knights of Columbus, we think of course of our Lord Himself and the apostles. We think of Our Lady and the saints. We think of the Venerable Father Michael McGivney, our founder, whose cause for canonization is presently in Rome. After all, we are about the work of these individuals in what we do.

Perhaps we could look further and discover even more models and intercessors for us as Knights of Columbus. Have we ever thought of the Archangels?

On September 29th we celebrate the Feast of Saints Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael, Archangels. Prior to Vatican Council II, this day only commemorated St. Michael and was known as "Michaelmas". On the present church calendar, this day commemorates all three. Each one is known for a special function they demonstrate in the Bible.

In Revelation 12:7-9, we see Michael as the warrior against evil, Captain of the Heavenly Host. In Daniel 12:1, we see him as protector of Israel and the Church. In Daniel 9, Gabriel is a messenger who announces the Messiah's coming. In Luke 1, he announces the births of John the Baptist and Jesus. Finally, in Tobit 5-12, Raphael serves as a guardian angel, protecting Tobias on his journey.

As Knights of Columbus, are we not called to be warriors against evilsuch as sins against human life, blasphemies and discrimination against our God and His church, the creeping secularization of our society and religious holidays? Are we not also called to be announcers of Good News by reaching out to the poor, the marginalized, the sick and dying? Are we not also called to be guardians of others by sponsoring and supporting programs and activities for young people, supporting vocations, defending the rights of the elderly, the terminally ill, and the unborn?

Yes, in all of this, the work we do as Brother Knights is in many ways a microcosm of the work of the angels. We should turn to them often for their example and intercession—just as we do the saints and Mary, Star of the Sea.
