In the Wake of Obergefell v. Hodges

Shortly after the attack on United States Naval Base Pearl Harbor by the empire of Japan, President Franklin Roosevelt deemed the day of the attack (December 7, 1941) "a date would appear to us as Catholics in general and Knights of Columbus in

position of the Church in this matter. Although the Church does not believe that same sex couples should be ostracized, mistreated or even matters of civil law or rights, Catholic Bishops (USCCB) and she nonetheless believes that

no Court of Law or contemporary social behavior is within its rights to re-define marriage, the properties and nature of which are held to be divine; i.e., that marriage is a union between one man and one woman.

Admittedly, the Court did seem to protect the rights of the Church in this matter by stating in the majority opinion: example of the Holy Family "Finally, it must be emphasized that religions, of Mary, Star of the Sea. and those who adhere to religious doctrines, may continue to advocate with utmost, sincere conviction that, by divine precepts, same-sex marriage should not be condoned. The First Amendment ensures that religious organizations and persons are given proper protection as they seek to teach the principles that are so fulfilling and so central to their lives and faiths, and to their own deep aspirations to continue the family structure they have long revered."
