Chaplain's Message

"Exalted With Christ"

Brother Knights:

Traditionally, when we think of the cross, sacrifice. etc. we do so with greatest focus during the Season of Lent, as indeed we should. However, we soon realize that day in our lives is not that easily "compartmentalized." No, we can identify with the cross and the sorrows of this life each and everyday in one way or another. Some of those times are rather minor;

a disappointment, an unkind recognized, etc. Others are much more serious or even traumatic; the suffering of a friend, the death of a loved one, the loss of employment, etc.

We see it on the news, we hear about it on the street, we experience it in our own lives —however great or small—the Cross.

This month celebrates a very special and important Feast in the liturgical year of the Church: The Exaltation (or Triumph) of the Cross. This is observed each year on September 14th. The miraculous discovery of the relic of the True Cross on September 14, 326, by Saint Helen, mother of Constantine, while she was on a pilgrimage to Jerusalem, is the origin of the tradition of celebrating this Feast on this particular date. It should be noted that the following day, September 15th is the Feast of Our Mother of Sorrows, for obvious reasons,

It is most appropriate our faith as it is lived out each that as we celebrate this feast and the message it conveys, we remind ourselves of the fact that our human suffering has redemptive value. Our sufferings in this life can and do take us toward the exaltation of the cross.


