Nomination for 2018 State Council Anchor Award

It is with great pleasure that Council #7669 nominates Brother and Sir Knight Bernard G. LaRocque of Swanton, VT to be recipient of the Anchor award.

Brother Bernard LaRocque is an honorary Life member of our Council and the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree as well. Bernie was born in Swanton almost 92 years ago and has been a lifelong resident there. His wife of 63 years, Terri, passed away in July 2015. With a big hole in his heart he has carried on quite well. He has remained active with the Council and his church and daily life.

Bernie is our most active <u>elderly</u> member of the Council. He attends nearly every monthly meeting and is always available to help for most of our fundraisers. At age 92 most members would be content to let others do the hands on work, but that's not Bernie. He is a great inspiration for those of us who are much younger and hesitate to volunteer.

Bernie and Terri raised seven (7) children. They have twelve (12) grandchildren, twenty-two (22) great grandchildren and three great grandchildren. He has many relatives in Canada and through out the US. Family has always been important to him.

Over his many years Bernie has been involved in his community, his church and his Council,

A master woodworker, as a hobby, Bernie has made many different items for friends, family and the church. He has a professional wood working shop in his basement.

He has built many items for the Nativity Church. Many years ago he built and installed 180 book racks for the missiletes and song books. Over the years the racks have gotten damaged or broken. He took it upon himself to refurbish all those same 180 book racks. Over many long hours, he removed each of the racks, made them larger, stained each piece, reassembled them and reinstalled each one. He had some help but mostly did all the work by himself. A daunting task for anyone much less a man of his age.

Bernie built an adjustable book stand for the Sanctuary at Nativity Church and a Crucifix stand for St. Joseph Mission in Isle La Motte. These are only a few of the items he has made over the years.

Bernie takes time to visit the sick, home bound and those in nursing homes. He invites others to join him on those visits. He supports handicapped folks by taking them to lunch or other affairs. He also offers to bring several widows to Mass and other events.

Bernie has several cousins in Canada, some of them operate truck farms. In the fall he gets free vegetables and delivers them to the Nativity Church food shelf. Bernie served in the Army Air Force during World war II as a crew member on transport aircraft. Fortunately he did not have to serve in combat areas. After his service he returned to VT and attended and graduated from St. Michael's College. He had a career with Union Carbide as a supervisor and retired from there.

Education has been a passion of Bernie's throughout his life. He served as chairman of the board for the Catholic school in Swanton for several years. He spearheaded a vocational training program during his work life at Union Carbide to assist young employees to improve their skills.

In the past few years he set a personal goal to raise \$10,000 for our Council's scholarship fund. Bernie has made many ties with local business leaders in the area throughout the years. Since Bernie is not a shy fellow he approached many of these contacts and requested that they consider becoming a "benefactor". In 2017 he reached and surpassed that \$10,000 goal. Not only did he succeed in that goal but he also convinced another Knight to take over the project and personally introduced him to each benefactor.

Bernie takes special interest in former Catholics and works with them helps them to return to the Faith. He helped to establish meetings for them to meet the Pastor. He attends the meetings and makes the introductions and helps in any way that he can. He does not give up on them very easily.

Bernie was a founding member and manager of the 26 member choral group known as the "Grandmas and the Grandpas". The group traveled the state of Vermont providing free shows at nursing homes and Senior centers and as Bernie would say "anywhere they would have us sing for free". Bernie served as manager for 25 years, stepping down when his voice began too fail. Without Bernie the group disbanded. Their financial support for expenses came from donations from the organizations they sang for.

Bernie enjoys attending the St. Micheal's Summer Playhouse. He usually takes a leaf peeping trip during foliage season with friends. Going out to lunch or dinner with friends is also part of his monthly routine. He is still a good driver in spite of his age. Many people are surprised when they find out his age. At 92 he still looks many years younger (some times he doesn't act his age either). Bernie has a great sense of humor and has many stories to share.

For all these reasons we are proud and honored to nominate Bernard G. LaRocque for the state Council's 2018 Anchor award. He is truly an anchor for our Council and the community.

- Laurie Queor draws up a flyer for the Carnival and barbeque and posts at the church.
- Peter Fitzgerald makes an announcement at the 4 p.m. Mass 8 September 218 and Sally Billado at the 1030 Mass 9 September about carnival ad barbecue

- Peter Fitzgerald, Doug Lantagne and Tom Fontaine from Milton Council prepare 75 chickens purchased from Steeple Market in Fairfax on the barbecue pit. [70 were sold and with some cash donations. Proceeds (\$859) went to Friar

# Suppliers. Thanks to Peter & Karen Fitzgerald, Vince & Marybeth Redding, and Bob Thompson for supplying all the food for the BBQ.)

- Jim Larose and Skyler Billado, Bob Thompson put up the bouncing house rented from Supersounds in Jericho for \$150.
- Ashley Billado and Cheyenne Long fill up the turtle with water.
- Games are put into place after Bob Thompson, Jim Larose, Guy Vanzo, Ally Redding, Jim Groseclose and Skyler Billado block off game areas with survey stakes and orange tape. The games are:
