## **Message from Supreme Knight**

August 21, 2018

Worthy Chaplains and Dear Brother Knights,

The issues that have come to light concerning sexual abuse by Archbishop Theodore McCarrick and in the Pennsylvania Grand Jury Report are cause for grave concern among Catholics and Brother Knights. Many feel deeply betrayed by those whom they long held in high regard. Such concerns are shared not just in the United States, but in Europe, Latin America and elsewhere.

These sins of commission and omission have sent the Church we love, the Church we serve and the Church that Jesus Christ established into convulsions. Sadly, the disgrace not only is borne by the perpetrators, it hurts us all, as does the silence of shepherds who have ignored the cries of their flocks.

There are many wonderful and faithful laborers in the vineyard of the Lord among our priests and bishops. However, it is clear that in addition to devastating criminal acts, we have seen many other moral failings by clergy that represent a crisis of commitment to the Gospel. Too often the needs of victims have been subordinated to a distorted sense of mercy toward the perpetrators or an instinct for clerical self-preservation. The sexual acts — both criminal and non-criminal — highlight the need to recover a respect for and a renewed commitment to the priestly promises of celibacy.

The Knights of Columbus has supported the pastoral and charitable work of our bishops and priests since our founding by the Venerable Father Michael McGivney. We understand that the priest should lead the parish and the bishop should be the center of unity in a diocese. But we — like all Catholics — are painfully aware of the wreckage that ensues when elements of this leadership are abdicated by evil actions whether directly perpetrated or covered up.

Now, the Knights of Columbus — laymen, priests and chaplains together — will have an important role to play in rebuilding the Church. We must

commit the Knights of Columbus to work for repentance, reform and rebuilding of the Church.

Repentance should include a full accounting of the misdeeds by those who have committed them. Archbishop McCarrick and others at fault owe us a full account of their actions, motivations and cover-ups. After years of having us confess to them, it is now time for them to come clean about what they have done and what they have failed to do.

This will also help increase the recognition that clerical sexual abuse is a global problem that must be addressed at the highest levels of the Catholic Church. Moreover, priests and bishops who refuse to live according to their promises of celibacy should be removed from public ministry, not out of retribution, but for the protection of the faithful and to prevent future variations of the scandal we now suffer.

Now is the time for all brother Knights to stand steadfast in faith, as Catholics and as gentlemen. We will assist priests, bishops and our fellow Catholics in helping the Church chart a course for the future that puts Christ at the center, so that truly we may say, "Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven." This is the moment in which Knights — including in a special way our priest members — can be part of a great renewal for good in our Church. And as we strive to follow the Lord more closely in the days ahead, may he deliver us from every evil and in his mercy graciously grant his Church peace and unity. In closing, know that your faithful witness and sacrifice can bring inspiration and hope to millions of your fellow Catholics. It will be needed in the days ahead more than ever before. And to every priest and bishop whose commitment and dedication to our Order and to our Church has been faithful and exemplary, please accept my gratitude in both a personal way and on behalf of the Knights of Columbus.

Let each one of us prayerfully invoke the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, so that in the words of St. Maximilian Kolbe, our hearts "would be cleansed and themselves become immaculate, similar and like unto her own heart."

As I sit here writing this, we are yet going through another heat wave in our beautiful State of Vermont. Please try and remember those folks who live alone or have no one to check on them as this heat can be brutal on our older generation. While your check in with these folks, inquire if they might need any assistance in moving their air-conditioners out of their windows as fall approaches.

This past month has been relatively quiet for your State Secretary with the exception of posting monies collected from various councils throughout the State for your 1<sup>st</sup> half per capita and charity assessment. To date, we have received payments from 17 councils, so we still have quite a few councils who have not submitted their checks (just a gentle reminder).

PSD Peter Laramie is in the process of finalizing the State Directory for the fraternal year and for those of you with internet access, this will be available for you in the very near future.

Your State Council has found a new space for our monthly meetings: the Burlington

International Airport has agreed to allow us to use one of their conference rooms at no charge! Plus they have agreed to give us parking vouchers, so the parking is free too! Thank you Gene Richards from the airport for making this happen.

Your State Council had scheduled a meeting in August with our MPC, but due to many conflicts, this did not come to fruition. We do have a meeting scheduled for September 15<sup>th</sup> at 1:00 PM at the airport. The highlights from this meeting will be in the next State Secretary's Corner.

ULTRASOUND UPDATE: Supreme has approved our request and has given us the go ahead to begin fund raising for a mobile unit to be used by Aspire Together, a pregnancy center in Burlington. Our State Deputy and I have opened an account for this and to date we have \$500.00 in this account. Supreme will be paying for the actual ultrasound machine, but we as Knights need to raise roughly \$50,000.00 for a van that will hold the machine which will then be used throughout the State of Vermont. I remind you of Worthy Supreme Knight Carl Anderson's address at our most recent convention: "statistics have proved that an ultrasound machine will SAVE over 25 babies per week"!!! I told Deb Couture, the Executive Director of Aspire Together that this may take us a few years to achieve, but we are committed to save as many babies as we possibly can. If your Council wants to hold a fund raiser for this, by all means, please do so. If you as a Knight and a catholic want to contribute, please consider doing so. A letter will be drafted soon and sent to all Councils in the jurisdiction of Vermont encouraging you to help with this fundraising effort. #### PERSONAL NOTE

With the latest news of the "priest scandal" from the Grand Jury in Philadelphia, and the latest letter from Cardinal Vigano, our Church is in the midst of some serious issues. Before I say anything else on this subject, please note that what I am writing is from me directly, a fellow Knight, and a fellow Catholic. These are my (Steve Shover) views and are NOT the views of the Knights of Columbus, the State Council or the Supreme Council.

The first and most disheartening aspect of these latest allegations is (and are) the victims of these outrageous abuses, including most recently those allegations brought forth in relationship to St. Joseph's Orphanage in Burlington.

Any child abused by a trusted member of the Church has been scarred for life and we (as Catholics and Christians) cannot and should NOT look at these victims with a blind eye; after all they are our brothers and sisters in Christ! We NEED to pray for all these people, even though they suffered many years ago from abuse. These scars may have somewhat healed, but bringing the issues back to the fore front is reliving the pain and suffering all over again. It's similar to scraping your arm or your leg and at first, it bleeds like a waterfall. With time, that wound will begin to heal and a scab will take its place. Now, it's as though the scab has returned and the media is literally ripping these scabs off and the individuals involved are feeling the pain all over again and are bleeding like that waterfall!

Our Worthy Supreme Knight, Carl Anderson wrote a lengthy article recently and it is well worth the read. Our Shepard, Bishop Christopher Coyne wrote a letter and it was read at all parishes in the Diocese of Burlington last Sunday. We as Knights CANNOT sit idly by, for this is OUR Church.

Again, we MUST pray for these victims that Our Lord will somehow bring healing and love to them at a time when they need it the most. Please PRAY for them!

On the other side of this ordeal, the abusers, yes, our priests have crossed the line and because of their position in the Church, many of them have "gotten away with it" or were simply moved from parish to parish. We all know that this was (and is) a coverup by the authorities that we put our faith and trust in. However, did not Jesus Himself say: "we are all sinners", whether a priest, a lawyer, a doctor, a teacher or anyone else who has committed these offenses. Our priests have been placed in a position where we go to them for spiritual counsel, the sacrament of reconciliation and they are to act "in persona Christ", the person of Christ. If you look at the percentages of those priests who have committed these crimes, the numbers may astound you, BUT we STILL have HOLY and GOOD priests in our midst and through all of this, they are suffering as well.

As Knights, we NEED to let our priests know that we have their backs and are here to support them in anyway that is needed in order for them to continue to be our spiritual leaders. We need to bring healing to them, but more importantly, we NEED to PRAY for them like we've never prayed before. On your way to work, say a decade of the Rosary, when you take a break from work, say an Our Father for their intentions. The list can go on and on as to what we can NOW do for our priests in the entire Diocese of Burlington. The next time you see your local parish priest, give him a pat on the back, or even a warm hug and thank him for all that does for your local Church. Let him know that he is appreciated and respected.

FOOTNOTE: I need to say it again my fellow knights that the views expressed here are my own and not the State Council. I simply felt within my heart that something needed and had to be said. Thank you.

SUMMER is almost over and September and the fall season is upon us! Keep the faith alive by supporting our seminarians and postulants. As the strong right arm of the church, the Knights of Columbus are committed to providing moral, financial and spiritual support to future priests and religious at all stages of their formation.

The Knights of Columbus stand in solidarity with our priests and religious. Through this program, council and parish families will raise funds to support seminarians in their area. For every \$500 given to an individual, the Supreme Council will refund the council or assembly \$100. The maximum refund a council or assembly can receive is \$400 per individual supported. Councils are also called to provide their "adopted" seminarian or religious aspirant with moral support and prayers for their success.

Our Refund Support Vocations Program (RSVP) Scholarship money is used by seminarians and those in religious formation for books, car insurance and maintenance, travel during vacations, clerical clothing, emergency expenditures and other living expenses.

The future of our church is directly tied to people answering God's call to a religious vocation. The RSVP (Refund Support Vocations Program) has been and is the primary program through which Knights of Columbus councils, assemblies and circles participate in an organized manner in supporting vocations to the priesthood and religious life. The Church, especially here in Vermont as we all know faces a crisis of vocations to the priesthood and religious life. As Knights we need to intensify our vocational promotion. The future of our church is directly tied to people answering God's call to a religious vocation. Promoting vocations to the priesthood and religious life is one of our highest priorities of the Knights of Columbus.
