State Meeting Springfield December 5-6-7

The Knights of Columbus state of Illinois meeting was held over the weekend of December 5-7 in Springfield at the Abraham Lincoln Hotel. In attendance were state officers and district deputies from all around the state. From the St Raphael Council 14171 were district deputy Tom Casey, and state officers Jim Russell of the KC Academy, the educational arm and Tim Rogers who is the state roundtable chairman. This meeting takes place twice a year and focuses on planning, training and goal setting. The district deputies then hold meetings with their councils. The primary messages focus on membership, programming and charities.

Some of the meeting highlights:

- Our State Deputy Skip Kinyon presented Special Olympics with a check for \$100,000. We Knights typically present them with a similar amount at the summer meeting. Special Olympics Illinois is the largest and most active chapter and the Knights are the largest supporter of this heartfelt cause. The world games are being held in Los Angeles this year commemorating their 50th anniversary where we have already donated \$1.5 million!!! This will be a big deal this year.
- Deputy Supreme Knight and Past Illinois State Deputy Logan Ludwig addressed the group and announced we have now placed over 500 ultra sound machines and donated over \$20 million to the Culture of Life Fund saving many lives. Just an fyi our St Raphael council championed the placement of the first ultra sound in the Joliet diocese in 2010.
 It was a councils'-wide team effort from several parishes and was placed at Waterleaf Woman's Center also saving many lives.
- The Annual Vocation Raffle was held on Saturday night at the State Deputies banquet and was a record setter bringing in over \$240, 000 all going to our 200+ Illinois seminarians. A special thanks to all those who participated for without your efforts none of this would be possible for our future priests appreciate your kindness and generosity.
- A special thanks to all Knights for your generosity and support in making results like this possible. Your dues and participation all add up to making great things happen.

Our council continues to make a big impact to our parish, community and even at the state level. You all make a difference. Keep up the good work and invite your friends to join us as we continue to be on the leading edge of the new evangelization.
