THE CHAPLAIN'S **CORNER**

Dear Brother Knights,

During the Easter Season our first readings are taken from the Acts of the Apostles while the gospel is proclaimed from St. John. The gospel readings record the resurrection appearances of our Lord. The readings from the Acts of the Apostles reveal an Easter people, anointed by Jesus with the Holy Spirit.

On Easter Sunday we heard these words spoken by St. Peter: "You know what has happened all overJudea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached, how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power." St. Peter would go on to say: "He [Jesus] commissioned us to preach to the people and testify that he is the one appointed by God as Judge of the living and the dead.... everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins through his name." Acts 10:42-43

How did St. Peter find the courage to make such a brave witness speech? Our Lord made a promise to his disciples that he would send them the Advocate, the Holy Spirit. St. Peter did not find courage, he was anointed by the same Holy Spirit that empowered Jesus in his mission of salvation.

When St. Peter and the apostles were told not to teach that Jesus was the Christ, they did not cower. They did not shrink from fear when the Sanhedrin had them jailed and whipped. Instead when they were released they rejoiced that they had been found worthy to suffer dishonor for the sake of the name....and for the privilege of leading others to God's mercy in Jesus.

Jesus promised his disciples that the Father would send the Holy Spirit in His name. Jn.14:26. As an individual and as a community of believers, the Holy Spirit is the animating source of our holiness and the driving singularity of our unity with God the Father and our Lord Jesus Christ. Jesus said that receiving the Holy

Spirit was being "clothed with power from on high." Lk 24:49 Think about what that means. We were clothed at Baptism with the holiness of Jesus Christ and our sins were washed clean. God has given us the pledge of eternal life.

The Holy Spirit gives us courage to witness our faith. For some, courage is required in the face of persecution, like our suffering brothers and sisters in the Middle East. For many of us courage is given so we can reject sin and continue to live our lives by Jesus's teaching. Jesus said: "My sheep hear my voice, I know them, and they follow me." Jn 10:27 "Who ever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him." Jn 14:23

God fills us with the Holy Spirit so we can convey our joy in the salvation we have received in Jesus. Our life in Christ is not a treasure to be hidden away. God wants us to be prophetic in our witness to Jesus and our kingdom values. That is why the Holy Spirit came upon the disciples in the upper room and why it rushed upon the gentiles.

The Holy Spirit has incorporated each of us into Christ, making us members of his body the Church. St. Paul wrote: "There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit. As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ. 1 Cor 12:7-12

As brother Knights of Columbus, as men of faith, let us be courageous. Witness your faith and share your gifts with your family, your parish, our council, amidst your coworkers and in our community. We are being "sent by Jesus as the Sacrament of Salvation offered to the world by God our Father." JPII
