

THE CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Dear Brother Knights,

June is often associated with weddings and the vocation of marriage. June is also the month in which our diocese ordains men to the priesthood and the diaconate. With that in mind, I would like to invite you to reflect on vocations.

The Lord said to Elijah: "You shall anoint Elisha, son of Shaphat of Abel-meholah, as prophet to succeed you." 1Kg 19:16. When Elijah came to the




place where Elisha was, Elijah threw his cloak over him. After disposing of his farm equipment, Elisha left and followed Elijah as his attendant. So began the formation of Elisha, one of God's greatest prophets.

As Jesus passed by the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting their nets into the sea; they were fishermen. Jesus said to them, "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." Then they left their nets and followed him. Mk 1:16-18

From these earliest days of the Church, Christ has call apostles and commissioned them to bring the message of salvation to the world. As the apostles went forth and established new congregations, they faced the need for help in spreading the Gospel. They turned to the community and asked them to recommend men they believed were upright, to share the apostolic work.

During those days Peter stood up in the midst of the brothers: ... "Therefore, it is necessary that one of the men who accompanied us the whole time the Lord Jesus came and went among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the



day on which he was taken up from us, become with us a witness to his resurrection." Peter and the one hundred and twenty persons, prayed to God to discern who would have a share in the apostolic ministry from which Judas turned away. After prayer, two names were submitted. "The lot fell upon Matthias, and he was counted with the eleven apostles." Acts 1:15ff



Bishop Donald J. Hying responded to his calling to the priesthood when he lived in Milwaukee, Wisconsin and was later ordained a bishop. On June 4, Bishop Hying will ordain two men to the diaconate. The apostles

called the community of disciples and said, "It is not right for us to neglect the word of God to serve at table. Brothers, select from among you seven reputable men, filled with the Spirit and wisdom, whom we shall appoint to this task, whereas we shall devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word." Act 6:2-4



Nathaniel Edquest [left] and Gregory Bim-Merle will be ordained as transitional deacons. Being ordained a "transitional" deacon, means that they are to continue their formation, in the hope of being ordained to the priesthood. After they have served as a deacon, Nathaniel and Gregory will have to decide if they feel called to the vocation of priesthood and the calling of celibacy. If so, Bishop Hying, may ordain them as a priest in 2017.

This summer, St. Elizabeth Seton will welcome Adam Antone to our parish. Adam is discerning a calling to the priesthood and will be participating in a summer internship. In August he may



begin his first year of theology at Mundelein Seminary. Brother Knights, if there is someone you believe has a vocation to the priesthood or religious life, tell that man or women. Then let your pastor or our Vocation Office know who you believe may have a calling from our Lord. As a men of faith, please pray for our seminarians and those soon to being ordained.

Once the infant is placed inside on the cushioned pad, three different alarms are sent to emergency responders and the infant is transported to a hospital to be checked out.

After a Memorial Mass, a Social Reception and a Black Tie Dinner for the Knights and their Ladies was held and if you still didn't have enough, we were welcomed to visit the hospitality suites hosted by

the Knights that were running for State Officers.
