

THE CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Dear Brother Knights,

Prayer has always been at the heart of Jesus's life. When Jesus was eight days old, his parents brought him into the temple. There they prayed and consecrated Jesus to the Lord. When we celebrate a baptism at mass, we are like Simeon and Anna who praised God for being able to see the coming of Christ. We are present to the birthing of a Christian!

As a child in Nazareth Jesus "grew and became strong, was filled with wisdom and the favor of the Lord was upon him." How did all of this happened. Part of the answer lies in Jesus' upbringing and spiritual practices.

On the day that Jesus went down to the Jordan river and was baptized by his cousin John, we find Jesus in prayer. "After all the people had been baptized and Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, heaven was opened and the Holy Spirit descended upon him." A voice came from heaven, with these words: "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus goes into the desert for forty days of prayer and fasting. After forty days of prayer, fasting and temptation by the devil, Jesus leaves the desert and begins spreading the good news. This month we will enter the season of Lent. Like Jesus we will face down some of our

When Jesus left the desert, we are told that he went to Nazareth where he had grown up and "went according to his custom into the synagogue on the Sabbath day." So we find that Jesus faithfully observed the Lord's Day and gathered with his community to worship God.

At the Lord's supper, he prayed that we would gather in his memory until he returned in glory. We thank God for saving us from sin through the sacrifice of his son on the cross. Jesus' life was lived as a prayer of self emptying. We should not be surprised by this constant theme of Jesus entering into a life of prayer, praise and petition. We find that Jesus took time to pray before he began his public ministry and through out his ministry.

Before Jesus picked his first disciples, he spent time in prayer. Jesus was in prayer on the mountain with his disciples, when he was transfigured. Surely this teaches how important and powerful prayer can be in our own lives.

Jesus was in prayer when his disciples pressed him to teach them how he prayed. As disciples we are blessed with the Lord's Prayer. Through it we learn the importance of praying with confidence; of praying for our needs and the importance of forgiveness.

Jesus prays for all of us, as witnessed by John 17:1. Jesus raised his eyes to heaven and said, "Father, give glory to your son...that he may give eternal life to all you gave him." When we pray for each other and with each other, as Jesus prayed for us, we can be confident of God's gracious benediction upon us as brother Knights and upon the good works of our council.


