THE CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Dear Brother Knights,

Three weeks ago we began with ashes and Jesus' teaching on the practices leading to blessedness. He taught his disciples to perform righteous deeds but not to showboat. Give alms in secret, make time for private pray with God, participate in fasting and do it joyfully. This is a good time for us to pause and take stock of our spiritual life.

During Jesus' forty day experience, the devil tempted him more than once. Surely you and I can appreciate being tempted multiple times throughout our life. There is something ironic about the fact that the more we desire union with God and a life of holiness, the more many of us struggle with temptations to sin. Being able to reject temptation is essential to our life as children of God.

Jesus had a deep desire to live in union with his Father. That is what motivated his whole life. I think how humble our Lord is in letting his disciples know he was almost tempted to sin.

In revealing that he was vulnerable to sin, Jesus teaches all of us how to resist the tempters lies. The apostles and Jesus' first disciples must have recounted this event in the life of our Savior many times.

St. Paul wrote: Draw your strength from the Lord and from his mighty power. Put on the armor of God so that you may be able to stand firm against the tactics of the

devil. For our struggle is not with flesh and blood but with the principalities, with the powers, with the world rulers of this present darkness, with the evil spirits in the heavens. Therefore, put on the armor of God, that you may be able to resist on the evil day and having done everything, to hold your ground. So stand fast with your loins girded in truth, clothed with righteousness as a breast-plate. And your feet shod in readiness for the gospel of peace. In all circumstances, hold faith a shield, to quench all [the] flaming arrows of the evil one. And take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is **the word of God.**Eph. 6: 10-17

In letting us know how the devil tempted Jesus, our Lord revealed to us the spiritual source of his strength. He spent time in prayer and meditated upon the scriptures making them his own. By that I mean, he could recall God's Word and they informed his thinking, actions and ultimately his identity.

Soon it will be Holy Week and Easter will be upon us. Jesus revealed he was God's Son when he died for our sins. God raised Jesus from the dead, and revealed his Son as Christ our Lord. I invite you to participate in one of the Lenten communal Penance Services and receive God's mercy. It is a wonderful way to be freed from sin; asking God to re-clothe us in grace. 
Prayer to God, the Source of Health
