THE CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

My Dear Brother Knights,

Just the other day while I was celebrating morning Mass, I came across this phrase in the opening prayer. "So, we may press forward all the more eagerly towards the worthy celebration of the Paschal Mystery." What truly caught me was the term



Paschal Mystery. I just wonder how many Catholics really understand what that means?

Ironically, the "Paschal Mystery" is the very center of our faith tradition. Without it there could be no Catholic faith nor any Catholic church. So, what is this vital component to our faith that few of us truly understand?

Its origins are found in the Jewish festival of Passover. The Book of Exodus tells us that the Israelites were asked to procure an unblemished lamb which would be slaughtered, roasted and eaten to honor God's deliverance of the His people from the slavery in Egypt. The blood of that pasch was placed over the doors of the homes of the Israelite people. Seeing that blood the Angel of Death would passover those homes, thus giving the feast its name, Passover.

When God chose to save His people again from the ravages of sin and death, he chose to send his Son by the power of the Holy Spirit and the special grace granted to his mother, Mary, who would be untainted (unblemished) by sin. The Immaculate Conception of Mary was the preparation for bringing the Unblemished Lamb of God into the world.

Jesus, The Lamb of God, who takes away our sins not only enters our world but at the end of his life he offers his blood on the cross as the final sign of our salvation. His suffering, death and resurrection becomes known to the Church as the Paschal Mystery. It is the amazing mystery that Christ would humble himself to become one with us and in so doing would also suffer the humiliation of the Cross, the indignity of his death but raised by the Father on the third day.

This is the mystery and wonder we celebrate every Easter. Easter Sunday is victory of The Christ over the grave and the assurance the we all can now share in Jesus' resurrection. We sign the song, "This is the Feast of Victory for our God." Our joy is found in the victory of the Paschal Mystery. Jesus suffered and died but rose to victory by the power of God.

May your Easter be one of blessing and peace! May the Joy of the Paschal Mystery truly be with you and your families!

A Founding Notion: Protecting the Breadwinner's Income

While jobs may be safer in 2017, accidents, injuries, and illnesses that can impact your ability to work still happen. Most, in fact, do not happen on the jobsite or place of employment. Give peaceful sleep to those who need rest for soul and body, and be with them in their hours of silence. Bless those who know not what another day will bring.


Make them ready for whatever it may be. Whether they must stand, or sit or be confined, grant them a strong spirit.
