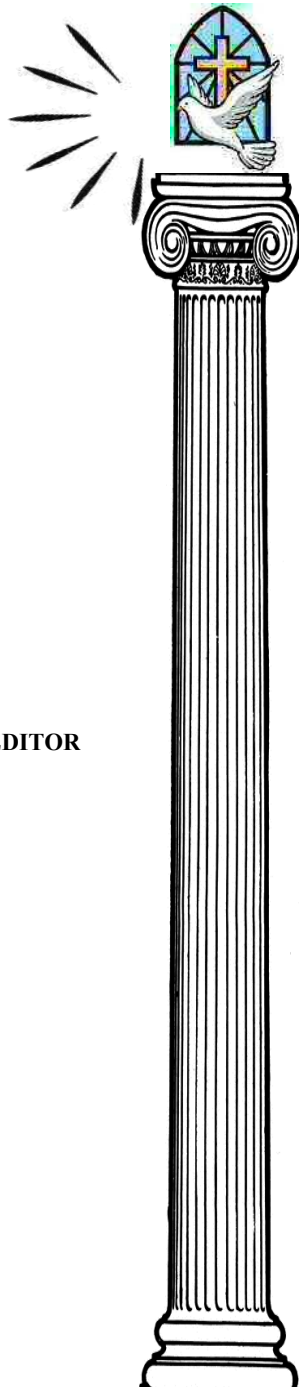

### Chaplain's Corner

My Dear Brother Knights,

Just the other day while I was celebrating morning Mass, I came across this phrase in the opening prayer. *"So we may press forward all the more eagerly towards the worthy celebration of the Paschal Mystery"* What truly caught my eye was the term Paschal Mystery. I just wonder how many Catholics really understand what that means? Ironically, the "Paschal Mystery" is the very center of our faith tradition. Without it there could be no Catholic faith nor any Catholic church. So what is this vital component to our faith that few of us truly understand?

Its origins is found in the Jewish festival of Passover. The Book of Exodus tells us that the Israelites were asked to procure an unblemished lamb which would be slaughtered, roasted and eaten to honor God's deliverance of the His people from the slavery in Egypt. The blood of that pasch was placed over the doors of the homes of the Israelite people. Seeing the blood the Angel of Death would passover those homes, thus giving the feast its name, Passover.

When God chose to save His people again from the ravages of sin and death, he chose to send his Son by the power of the Holy Spirit and the special grace granted to his mother, Mary, who would be untainted (unblemished) by sin. The Immaculate Conception of Mary was the preparation for bringing the Unblemished Lamb of God into the world.

Jesus, The Lamb of God, who takes away our sins not only enters our world but at the end of his life he offers his blood on the cross as the final sign of our salvation. His suffering, death and resurrection becomes known to the Church as the Paschal Mystery. It is the amazing mystery that Christ would humble himself to become one with us and in so doing would also suffer the humiliation of the Cross, the indignity of his death but raised by the Father on the third day.

This is the mystery we celebrate every Easter and every Sunday after that. The Sunday Mass allows us to enter into Christ's victory over the grave. It reminds us of the assurance that we all can now share in Jesus' resurrection. We sign the song, "This is the Feast of Victory for our God." Our joy is found in the victory of the Paschal Mystery. Jesus suffered and died but rose to victory by the power of God.

May the remainder of the Easter Season be a blessing of Jesus' gift of peace! May the Joy of the Paschal Mystery truly bewith you and your families! May that same Mystery lead you to discover the love of Jesus in a more profound way throughout the rest of the year!

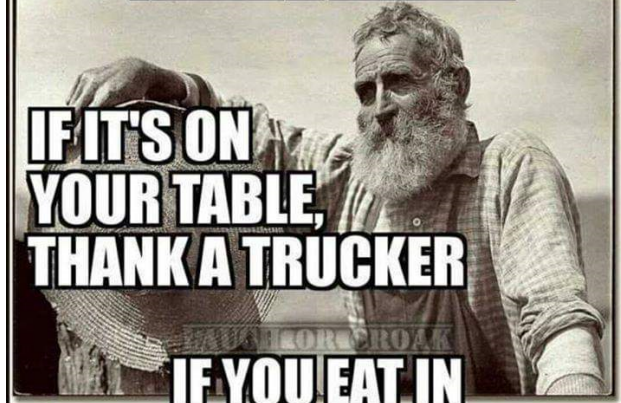

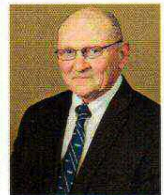

#### HOW THE APOSTLES DIED.

1. Matthew. Suffered martyrdom in Ethiopia, Killed by a sword wound.
2. Mark. Died in Alexandria, Egypt , after being dragged by Horses through the streets until he was dead.
3. Luke. Was hanged in Greece as a result of his tremendous Preaching to the lost.
4. John. Faced martyrdom when he was boiled in huge Basin of boiling oil during a wave of persecution In Rome. However, he was miraculously delivered From death.  
John was then sentenced to the mines on the prison Island of Patmos. He wrote his prophetic Book of Revelation on Patmos . The apostle John was later freed and returned to serve As Bishop of Edessa in modern Turkey . He died as an old man, the only apostle to die peacefully
5. Peter. He was crucified upside down on an x shaped cross. According to church tradition it was because he told his tormentors that he felt unworthy to die In the same way that Jesus Christ had died.
6. James. The leader of the church in Jerusalem , was thrown over a hundred feet down from the southeast pinnacle of the Temple when he refused to deny his faith in Christ. When they discovered that he survived the fall, his enemies beat James to death with a fuller's club.  
  
This was the same pinnacle where Satan had taken Jesus during the Temptation.
7. James the Son of Zebedee was a fisherman by trade when Jesus Called him to a lifetime of ministry.  
  
As a strong leader of the church, James was beheaded at Jerusalem. The Roman officer who guarded James watched amazed as James defended his faith at his trial.  
  
Later, the officer Walked beside James to the place of execution. Overcome by conviction, he declared his new faith to the judge and Knelt beside James to accept beheading as a Christian.
8. Bartholomew. Also known as Nathaniel. He Was a missionary to Asia. He witnessed for our Lord in present day Turkey. Bartholomew was martyred for his preaching in Armenia where he was flayed to death by a whip.

9. Andrew. He Was crucified on an x-shaped cross in Patras, Greece. After being whipped severely by seven soldiers they tied his body to the cross with cords to prolong his agony. His followers reported that, when he was led toward the cross, Andrew saluted it in these words, "I have long desired and expected this happy hour. The cross has been consecrated by the body of Christ hanging on it". He continued to preach to his tormentors For two days until he expired.
10. Thomas. He Was stabbed with a spear in India during one of his missionary trips to establish the church in the Subcontinent.
11. Jude. He Was killed with arrows when he refused to deny his faith in Christ.
12. Matthias. The apostle chosen to replace the traitor Judas Iscariot. He was stoned and then beheaded.
13. Paul. He Was tortured and then beheaded by the evil Emperor Nero at Rome in A.D. 67. Paul endured a lengthy imprisonment, which allowed him to write his many epistles to the churches he had formed throughout the Roman Empire. These letters, which taught many of the foundational Doctrines of Christianity, form a large portion of the New Testament.

Perhaps this is a reminder to us that our sufferings here are indeed minor to compare to the intense persecution and cold cruelty faced by the apostles and disciples during their times For the sake of the Faith. And ye shall be hated of all men for my name's sake: But he that endureth to the end shall be saved.

Pass on to encourage other Christians. Why Do we feel sleepy in Prayer, but stay awake through a 3 hour movie?  
Why are we so bored when we look at the HOLY BOOK. But find it easy to read other books?

Why is it so easy to ignore a message about God,
