## GRAND KNIGHT CORNER



There are certain historic dates that we can look back and recount where we were on that day and during that time. For example, for those of us old enough to remember (or having been born in that era) can recall where we were when President Kennedy was assassinated. Most of us can remember where we were on the day of the Challenger Space Shuttle disaster or where we were during the Loma Prieta earthquake. Many can probably even recite the date of each of those events. Where were you on those dates?

While attending church this past year I have made some observations that have surprised me. Most recently I have noticed a decline in attendance. For example, I attended the Chrism Mass at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament. That is an event that I have attended fairly regularly over the past several years.

Historically, the Chrism Mass is usually so well attended that the choir loft opened, filled to capacity, and standing room only in the main body of the cathedral. This year (and much to my disappointment) I would estimate the cathedral was only 75% full and the choir loft was not opened for overflow.

At St. Paul for the Easter Vigil service (8pm mass on Holy Saturday) I was surprised that the parish was not filled to capacity even though we had 30 additional RCIC and RCIA candidates who received their sacraments of Baptism, Holy Communion, and Confirmation and witnessed by their families friends. Where were you on that date?

During Lent we had Stations of the Cross and the usual simple meal that followed. Most every month we have a First Friday where the Blessed Sacrament is exposed and made available for prayer. In the last several months, Brother Peter Arnez has led the Rosary just prior to each of our Council 6922 General Business Meetings. Where were you on those days? Believe me, I'm no saint, either. Many of those dates I was not present.

With that said, what does that say about us? As Knights, if we are to lead by example, just what kind of leaders and examples are we?

On Divine Mercy Sunday we witnessed an unprecedented historic event ... the canonization of Popes John Paul II and John XXIII as saints in the Catholic Church. 10 years from now, will you remember where you were when Pope Francis canonized the two popes into sainthood? Was the canonization of two popes into sainthood an event that will be significant enough in your life that you will remember when it occurred? Needless to say, we could all do better. Let us all try to be good Christians and good examples to our community.

Finally, I would be remiss if I neglected to announce the recent exemplification of one of our newest brother Knights, Charles Brown. Brother Charles has a very serious health condition and is unable to leave his home. Against all odds, he recently expressed a very strong desire to become a Knight. Worthy District Deputy Tim Fukuda authorized that a special exemplification ceremony could be convened at his residence and Brother Charles was exemplified on May 2, 2014. I am happy to say that he is our 10<sup>th</sup> new member in this Columbian year.

My term as Grand Knight is almost up. There have been many occasions when I have felt honored to have been a participant in certain events and functions. Particularly, I am always very happy when we exemplify a new member into our order of brotherhood. I hope that all of my brothers feel their lives have been enriched by the events you have experienced in the Knights of Columbus, too.

## ACTS 2:1-11 RECEIVE THE HOLY SPIRIT

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven staying in Jerusalem. At this sound, they gathered in a large crowd, but they were confused because each one heard them speaking in his own language. They were astounded, and in amazement they asked, "Are not all these people who are speaking Galileans? ...yet we hear them speaking in our own tongues of the mighty acts of God."

**The Holy Spirit - God's gift** "God is Love" and love is his first gift, containing all others. "God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us." Because we are dead or at least wounded through sin, the first effect of the gift of love is the forgiveness of our sins. The communion of the Holy Spirit in the Church restores to the baptized the divine likeness lost through sin. He, then, gives us the "pledge" or "first fruits" of our inheritance: the very life of the Holy Trinity, which is to love as "God [has] loved us." This love (the "charity" of 1 Cor 13) is the source of the new life in Christ, made possible because we have received "power" from the Holy Spirit. CCC, 733-735
