At each meeting you will see this event on the signup sheet. Please consider signing up for a timeslot. Traditionally the wee hours of the morning are the hardest to fill.


Fall Tamale season is upon us!

Faith Director Still Needed

Our Council has been without a faith director for over a year.

Granted, for most of that year we've had to endure the restrictions of Covid, with virtual masses and virtual meetings during the lockdown.

But now things are opening up we have an urgent need for faith director.

The faith director obviously is tasked with helping out the brothers with their faith journeys, with only a few events on the schedule. This is a great opportunity for brother that's already quite involved in the parish spiritually, to help lead the brothers.

Council Forms a Degree Team

The Council had an inaugural meeting, led by Brother Knight Mike Green to start up a degree team with the new format.

For those that may not know the new ceremony is an all-in-one degree that encompasses what used to be the first, second, and third degree in a single ceremony. Supreme has done away with the robes for the former degrees, replacing them with sashes, and altered the ceremony so that it's possible to read the parts. This makes it much, much easier to form a degree team. As well as cheaper. In the new ceremony, wives and children are invited as well.

The meeting was well attended, attracting nearly a dozen brothers and dates have been set for the new ceremony being held at All Saints as well as a modest budget for refreshments. We'll also need help, as usual, for setup, serving, and cleaning up at the event.

Practices are set for October 28 and November 10th with an expectation that our first ceremony will be December 9th.


