Member Profile: Mr. John (Jack) Lawler



John P. (Jack) Lawler was 92years old on June 20, 2018. He is the oldest of four children. He was born in Indianapolis, Indiana, attended elementary school at St Joan of Arc parish and high school at Cathedral High School. In 1942 the family moved to Buffalo, NY and Jack completed his school training at Amherst Central HS in Snyder, NY in 1944. Later in That year he enlisted in the U.S. Navy. He was trained as Aerographer Mate (weatherman) and was assigned to NAS, Norfolk, at the Air Command. In July of 1944 he was reassigned to the Midway, CVB41. He is a Plank Owner of the Midway as being a member of the first

commissioned crew aboard a Navy ship. The Midway was the first of a new class of a Navy Carrier Class. It was the first of three carriers with a one-thousand-foot steel deck. As the war ended in August, 1945, Jack was honorably discharged from duty on June 19, 1946.

Jack's family had moved to Columbus, OH while he was in the service. He returned to Columbus to rejoin his family. In September, 1946 he enrolled at the Ohio State University on the G.I. Bill. He graduated in June, 1950 with a BS in Business Administration majoring in Marketing. His family had relocated to Cincinnati, OH, while he was in school, and he joined them after graduation. His first job in Cincinnati was with General Electric, Aircraft Gas Turbine division in the purchasing department. After 2 ½ years as a buyer, he accepted a position with Camcar Screw and Manufacturing in Chicago, Ill. In sales. While in Chicago, he was married to his wife, Mary Jane Schutte. It lasted 57 wonderful years. They had two boys and a girl.

The following ten years Jack had a management position with Aeronca and Texaco Experiment, Inc. Texaco Inc. transferred him to the corporate headquarters in New York. In 1973, fter nine years with Texaco, he left the corporate world and moved to Louisville. He joined his father and started Lawler and Associates, a management and financial service company. In 1977, Lawler and Associates merged with Michael Boone's American Temporary Services. The merged company was named Famco, Inc. and had four operations, American Temporary Services, American Data Services, ACDI, and Lawler and Associates.

In 2004, Jack's wife, Jane became seriously ill. He retired and reduced his work load to take care of her until she died in 2009. Jack took his Knight's of Columbus first degree in 1950 and became a third degree in Cincinnati.
