On September 16, 2018, The Knights held a pancake breakfast. 129 people enjoyed all the pancakes and sausages they could eat plus coffee, orange juice and milk. Our goal was 200, but we still made over \$900.00. Most of that was from the sale of ads for the placemats. The Council has several chaitable organizations to which to contribute from this event including the Immaculata playground project.

We contracted with ChrisCakes to put this on for us. They pretty much furnished everything, and put on quite a show. Participants were given a plate as their ticket. The ChrisCakes guy flipped the pancakes toward your plate and you had to catch them. Obviously a few were missed and fell on the floor. He would ask you to move back and still hit your plate most of the time. One fellow moved back about thirty feet and still caught the pancake. It was all you can eat pancakes and sausages. Also, the pancakes and sausages were very good.

The boy scouts will continue their annual pancake breakfast on December 9th, and we will do it each quarter the rest of the year. Our next pancake breakfast will tenatively be in February, 2019.

Member Profile: SK Dick Burnes



Dick Burns is a native Louisvillian, a 3rd generation Knight, and a graduate of St. Margaret Mary. When he first started playing on the school's baseball and football teams they were called the Rebels. When the football team needed new uniforms, his Dad, owner of Burns Ford (which later became Bill Collins) agreed to buy them. The Pastor, Fr. Stuart, wouldn't let Dick Sr. put the dealership's name on the uniforms, but he let him change the mascot to Ford's newest model – The Mustang!

Dick went on to graduate from St. X in 1969. While there, he met the love of his life Suzanne when he was performing in a Senior play at Sacred Heart. She was his first date (2/15/68, which he still celebrates every year) and they were married not quite 5 years later.

After St. X, Dick attended Speed School at UofL where he earned a Master's degree in Chemical Engineering. He interned for Du Pont in Rubbertown while a student and took a job with them when he graduated. Instead of taking a job offer at the plant here in town, he asked his new bride to join him in going to "see the world" for 5 or 6 years, intending to move her back home. 34 years and 9 moves later, with a corporate career that took him from Beijing to Bahrain, he finally made good on his promise and brought her back home. Dick and Suzanne live in Owl Creek and are blessed to share their home with their daughter Hilary (born in Wilmington, DE) and their granddaughter Jordan (born in Houston, TX). They enjoy being "the Waltons of the 21st century" and Dick will tell everyone that there's nothing better than getting to come home to your grandchild every day, and your grandchildren are your reward for having children!

In a successful attempt to strengthen his spiritual life, Dick decided to surround himself with likeminded Catholic gentlemen and joined the Order over 26 years ago. His second year in, he jumped into the role of Grand Knight of his first Council in Houston, St. Paul the Apostle Council #6234. He also helped form a new council in his then home parish, St. Bernadette Council #10959.

When he was transferred back home, Dick joined Bishop Spading Council #2761, where his father and grandfather had been members. When he was approached by Former District Deputy Ken Rosenbaum, and then Field Agent Bill Moriarity to establish a new council at St. Margaret Mary, he eagerly took on the challenge.

It was made easier by all the contacts he had made through his involvement in the parish as a Lector, Eucharistic Minister, and a leader in the parish Men's Ministry and Christ Renews His Parish. He was persistent in overcoming the pastor's initial resistance to having a parishbased council, convinced him that he would get a lot of value and manpower by having his own council, and that we would grow much faster as parish-based council than we would if the men had to go to another parish to participate in the works of the Order.

And he was right. Dick used the skill sets that have helped him in his business career in his service as Council 15979's Charter Grand Knight. In our first year under Dick's leadership as Grand Knight we were a 5.5 Star Council, and we were also a Star Council in his second year. He's proud of the job Past Grand Knight Mike Saylor did in keeping that streak alive, and confident that current Grand Knight will maintain it. In our short 4-year history, we've grown to over 90 members and have been a Star Council every year!

When Ken Rosenbaum's health forced him to cut his term as District Deputy short, he recommended Dick as his replacement to incoming State Deputy Gabe Cabral. Dick was happy to accept this new challenge and continue his service to the Order by guiding five Councils. In his first year he was one of only two Star District Deputies and was the only Star District Deputy in Kentucky in his second year. Based on that strong performance, Dick was elected at our 2018 State Convention to serve the Order at the next level by taking a seat on the on our State Council as the Kentucky State Warden!

Dick is a strong believer in the Mission of the Knights of Columbus. He saw the value in surrounding himself with good Catholic gentlemen as the main reason for joining the order, and then became an insurance member, too. Dick strongly believes that we owe it to all Catholic

gentlemen, especially young fathers, to provide them the opportunity to strengthen and protect their families.

Dick is retiring at the end of 2018 and will have plenty to keep him busy as an active member of Council 15979 and as a State Officer but is planning to look for other volunteer opportunities as well (after he sleeps the first month!).
