### A MESSAGE FROM OUR CHAPLAIN

Rev. Fr. Frank Wagner

My brother Knights,

We hear a lot these days about the “new” evangelization. In this Jubilee Year of Mercy, evangelization starts when we recognize and try make concrete in our everyday lives our belief that the very nature of God is mercy, that Jesus Christ is the merciful face of the Father and that we need to become “merciful as Your Father is merciful.” On the occasion of the feast day of St. Peter Claver, S.J., who dedicated his life to the abused African slaves in seventeenth century Columbia, Pope Francis reflected on the theme of evangelization. He said:

This man (Peter Claver) did not stroll along saying he evangelized: he did not reduce evangelism to a rote task, and even to a proselytizing; he proclaimed Jesus Christ with his actions, speaking to the slaves, living with them, living like them – and there are many like him in the Church – many people who annihilate themselves to proclaim Jesus Christ – and all of us, brothers and sisters, have an obligation to evangelize – and that does not mean a knock on the neighbour’s door to say: “Christ is risen!” – it is living the faith, talking about it with meekness, with love, with no desire to win an argument (It. *convincere*), but [to give it away] for free: giving away freely that which God has given to me – that is what it means to evangelize.

Look, the last thing you need to do is say something! Begin to do, and he will see what you are doing and ask you about it; and when he asks you, then tell him. To evangelize is to give this testimony: I live the way I do, because I believe in Jesus Christ; I awaken in you a curiosity, so you ask me, “But why are you doing these things?” The answer: “Because I believe in Jesus Christ and preach Jesus Christ and not just with the Word” – you must proclaim the Word – but with your life.

My brother Knights, as the Nike® commercial says: ***Just do it!***

In this article we’ll focus on the “Community,” and ways that we, as Knights, can dedicate our support of this category.

### VOLUNTEERISM

Let’s celebrate National Volunteer Week each April. This coming year it is April 23-29, 2017. This is a valuable opportunity to offer volunteers in our council and community some well-deserved recognition and praise. Go to [www.volunteer.ca](http://www.volunteer.ca) for more information.

Let’s participate in “Make a Difference Day.” This is a national day of community service by joining thousands of other volunteers across Canada who will plan and carry out projects in their communities on October 24 (fourth Saturday) each year.

### HUMAN NEEDS

Housing, food and health all have two things in common: they represent human needs, and they offer a fertile field for community service projects.

Among ways to address these needs are:

- donating council services to food banks and soup kitchens that rely on volunteers;
- conducting food drives in our council and community;
- supporting groups that deliver meals to homebound people through “Meals on Wheels”;
- visiting and offering encouragement and support to the elderly;
- working with groups that give people with disabilities the ability to live independently;
- helping groups that assist senior citizens;
- providing transportation for the elderly for Mass, shopping, visiting relatives or doctor appointments.

These are just some of the ways we, as practicing Knights can support Human Needs.

In the next two articles (in November and December issues) we’ll continue to look at “Community” with the following topics: Civic Involvement, Environment, and Public Safety, Health Services, Decency, and Honouring Columbus.
