I would like to begin by wishing everyone a Happy Thanksgiving with the following reflection from A Catholic Prayer Book compiled by Msgr. Michael Buckley:

In Gratitude

Thank you, Father,

For having created us and given us to each other in the human family.

Thank you for being with us in all our joys and sorrows,

For your comfort in our sadness,

Your companionship in our loneliness.

Thank you for yesterday, today, tomorrow and for the whole of our lives.

Thank you for friends, for health, for grace. May we live this and every day conscious of all that has been given to us.

A short week after Thanksgiving we will begin the Advent Journey. Advent has been around for a long time, long before it was actually called "Advent," and possibly as early as the 2<sup>nd</sup> century. Originally, it was celebrated for 40 days, just like the Lenten season. Advent is given to us as a time to prepare our souls for the coming of the Lord. This season is very similar to Lent, so its nickname is the "Little Lent." In our current culture, we are tempted to skip over the penitential aspects of Advent and focus on the joy of Christmas. Focusing on the joy alone denies a crucially important truth: that the Christ Child. Our Lord and Savior. suffered and died for our salvation. May I ask that all of my Brothers and Sisters focus upon Keeping **Christ In Christmas!!!!!**

Are you ready for the next four weeks of Advent which begins on Sunday, December 2nd and ends on Monday, December 24<sup>th</sup>?

You could say that if you were at the St. Paul's Abbey event on November 16th then you have indirectly started to prepare for the Advent season through the making of the wreath.

Why do we make and decorate wreaths and what does it mean? The circular shape of the wreath signifies continuous life, without beginning or end which symbolizes the eternity of God.

You may not realize it but the decorations that you place on the wreaths also have Christian meaning. The use of evergreens reminds us of our eternal life with Christ; pointy holly leaves and berries represent the crown of thorns from the Passion of Jesus and his Precious Blood; the pine cones symbolize Christ's Resurrection; the cedar signifies strength and healing and the laurel signifies victory over persecution and suffering. So the next time you look at your decorated wreath you will be reminded of both the immortality of our souls and God's promise of everlasting life to us through Christ. The Advent wreath and candles altogether give us, CHRIST - HOPE - FAITH - JOY - PEACE.

We should be encouraged to look at the wreath and contemplate the meaning of Advent and prepare our hearts and minds for the Lord's birth on the eve of Christmas.
