In doing so, I wish to reflect upon literature that I have recently come across pertaining to "The smoke of Satan has entered the Church". The Feb 17<sup>th</sup> edition of the Star Ledger newspaper included 4 pages listing priests of the New Jersey Diocese's who were charged with engaging in improper sexual behavior.

Paul Harvey, Radio Broadcaster once stated "In times like these, it is helpful to remember, that there have always been times like these." Sexual scandals and improper behavior among religious leaders are nothing new. This is not the time to despair. Corrupt Church leaders have existed since Christ established the Church---and have not prevailed. Author Rod Bennett in his book Bad Shepherds revealed that Catholic laity---often shone brightest just when their bad shepherds were at their worst. **Prayer Journal** 

What do you do when someone asks for prayer? How do you track whom you offered a prayer for?

Perhaps you stop and pray right then or pray the next time you think of that person, but do you keep praying continuously until the prayer has been answered?

It's easy to say you'll pray for something, and then completely forget to do it. It's almost second nature to say "our thoughts and prayers are with you" when tragedy hits—but that doesn't mean very much when you don't have prayers to offer them.

One of my relatives shared with me how she keeps track of her offered prayers. She said that she records the prayer request in a prayer journal. That way she remembers the names and the specific intention of each person. As she prays each day, she'll pull out her journal and pray for the individuals written in her book.

A prayer journal helps hold you accountable, and it provides a reference for you to go back and revisit. Prayer is an ongoing process. Using a prayer list helps you to remember. I don't know about you but the older I get, the more I need to jot things down to remember what I need to do. Sometimes, you have to pray for things more than once. For instance: praying for patience, praying for spiritual growth, praying for a new job opportunity, praying for a successful surgery, praying for a speedy recovery, praying for the repose of someone who died and so on.
