Mike Jensen

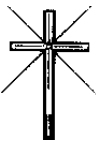

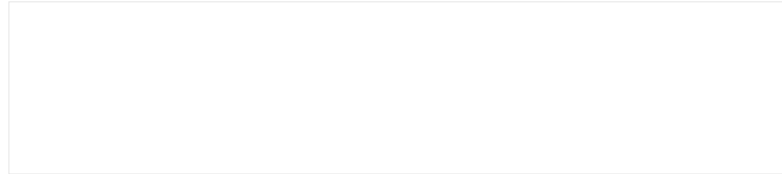
