Chaplain's Message by Rev. John Sauer

The season of Advent is upon us and with it comes all of the hectic preparation for our celebration of Christmas. The Church tells us that during this season we prepare for the return of Christ at the end of time, and we prepare to celebrate his birth at Christmas.

This is a reminder to us that Christ has already come. We do not wait for his first coming but for his return. There are parts of the traditions of the Church that remind us of that. Some Christmas carols, for example, speak of his death. Elements of the traditional Christmas decorations also highlight this reality.

My predecessor at St. Casimir in Winona used to give out candy canes and a little description of the symbolism behind the various shapes and colors. I have lost that but here is a little description from another source. It is a reminder that we can use any aspect of our Christmas preparation to remember the spiritual core of this feast.

A candy maker in Indiana wanted to make a candy that would be a witness, so he made the Christmas candy cane. He incorporated several symbols for the birth, ministry, and death of Jesus Christ. He began with a stick of pure white, hard candy. White to symbolize the Virgin Birth and the sinless nature of Jesus, and hard to symbolize the Solid Rock, the foundation of the Church, and the firmness of the promises of God.

The candy maker made the candy in the form of a "J" to represent the precious name of Jesus, who came to earth as our Savior. It could also represent the staff of the "Good Shepherd" with which He reaches down into the ditches of the world to lift out the fallen lambs who, like all sheep, have gone astray.

Thinking that the candy was somewhat plain, the candy maker stained it with red stripes. He used three small stripes to show the stripes of the scourging Jesus received by which we are healed. The large red stripe was for the blood shed by Christ on the cross so that we could have the promise of eternal life.

Unfortunately, the candy became known as a Candy Cane – a meaningless decoration seen at Christmas time. But the meaning is still there for those who "have eyes to see and ears to hear".

The Owatonna Special Olympics received a check Wednesday, October 16th, from the Owatonna Knights of Columbus Council 945. The check for \$4,165.25 will help pay for things like uniforms, camps, and travel costs. The money is the result of the KC's annual Smokin' in Steele event. The barbeque contest drew thousands of visitors from around southern Minnesota to sample the best in barbeque and blues music. It's an event the KC's are happy to sponsor for such a worthy cause.

"This is at the core of our mission," says organizer and Past Grand Knight Joe Elbert. "Smokin' in Steele is a great event as it is, but seeing the happy faces on these athletes makes it all the better. We're so proud to be able help Special Olympics. It makes us want to make next year an even better one."

Smokin' in Steele has been held for the past three years at the Steele County Fairgrounds in Owatonna. The event draws barbeque professionals from around the nation, and is sanctioned by the Kansas City Barbeque Society. It also brings a number of prominent bands from around the region. The 2010 event drew more than 2,800 guests, 39 professional barbeque teams, and 10 professional barbeque vendors selling award-winning food to the public. 2010 William Warner Scholarship Recipients Announced.

Courtney Kramer: Courtney is the daughter of Brother Knight Jeff and Jeanne. She will be studying English and Political Science at the College of St. Benedict.

Mary Nguyen: Mary is attending the University of St. Thomas, studying Pre-Med. She is the daughter of Sir Knight Tony and wife Yen. Christina Rozeske: Christina will be studying English at the University of St. Thomas, as well as playing hockey for the Tommies. She is the daughter of Sir Knight Bruce and wife Lora.

Each of the recipients will be awarded \$350.00.

The William Warner Scholarship was established on May 10, 1972. The original amount was \$6000.00 and the Council gave out one scholarship in the amount of \$300.00. The funds came from the estate of Brother Knight William Warner who died at a young age in a tragic accident. The scholarship was set up so that as the funds increased, so would the amount of monies dedicated to scholarships.

By December, 1987 the fund had \$11467.30 in CDs and the council donated an additional \$523.70 to have a total of \$12,000. By September, 2000 the fund had \$22,046.06 invested in Fortis Funds. Today it is about \$24,000 and it is invested with Hartford Mutual Funds Inc. In 2011, individual Knights will have the opportunity to donate additional dollars to the fund so that scholarships can continue to be awarded to graduating seniors.
