Grand Knight's Message by Dan Wolfe

Brother Knights,

This month's message is about dollars and sense. I know I am referring to sense vs. cents in this phrase. But dollars and sense is what your Council officers spent a good amount of discussion on recently. By now all of you should have received your Council dues statement for 2015. As you may have noticed, the annual dues amount has increased to \$36 for this year. For the past four years the dues amount remained at \$32 and your Council officers all agreed it was time to review our dues as our Council expenses and funding requests have also gone up over these past four years. The question boiled down to what dollar amount made sense. Too small of an increase and we could be back addressing the same fiscal issue in a year or two; too large of an increase and we could impact on our member's ability or willingness to contribute. As stewards of our Council, it was an important but difficult decision but after much discussion and input, a consensus was reached.

Our Council fees are still quite reasonable, \$3 per month, given the benefits our Council provides to its members and the community at large. As in years past, your fee statement also includes the voluntary contribution of \$3 towards the William Warner Scholarship Fund. I am very pleased and grateful that nearly all of you make this contribution when paying your dues and I truly hope you will continue to support this worthy cause. Our annual dues are the primary funding source for our Council but they can only help us meet our monthly fiscal obligations when they are in our bank account. So I urge you to please send in your dues payment as quickly as you can. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

I almost forgot to talk about that other blue sheet in with your fee statement. If you have been to any of our general Council meetings

statement. If you have been to any of our general Council meetings since I became Grand Knight, you would have heard discussions about the need to increase OUR fund raising efforts as a Council. We have continued to increase the level of charitable giving over the years but have come to the point we have had to say no to some worthy requests because our available funds are low, especially near the end of the year. The Minnesota Knights Foundation Raffle that you have with your fee statement is one of the additional funding sources we have adopted this year. Not only are there substantial cash prizes to be won, but for each ticket sold, 50% of the income stays directly with our Council. And by participating, our Council becomes eligible to apply for matching financial grants from the Foundation for future capital or other worthwhile projects.

So I encourage each of you to support this raffle and also mark your calendar to attend the February 8th Pancake Breakfast and the March 6th Lenten Fish Fry. The proceeds from each of these events goes directly to OUR charitable organization, Council 945. So please join us for a great meal and help promote our ticket sales for these events. It is all about dollars and sense.
