Chaplain's Message by Rev. James Starasinich

Dear Brother Knights,

May this New Year be filled with many blessings and graces for you and your families!

The January general meeting will have an evangelization team who is coming to St. Joseph Parish in February speak and ask for our prayerful support. In these confused times, they come to bring the Gospel through their own lived experience in the Church. I am praying that this moment of evangelization will plant a seed that will grow and flourish as Jesus speaks in the Gospel: "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed that a person took and sowed in a field. It is the smallest of seeds, yet when full-grown it is the largest of plants. It becomes a large bush, and the 'birds of the sky come and dwell in its branches" (Matthew 13:31-32). It is about Blessed Franz Jägerstätter, a husband and father from Austria, whose faith in Jesus Christ guides him during the difficult time of the Nazi regime. We need witnesses like this to encourage us. May you find the time to see this film and be inspired by Franz's life and commitment to faith and family. That is what we Knights are all about!
