The original funds came from the William Warner Family, whose son died at a young age, and the KC members have also contributed funds over the years. The Council is responsible for Fund investments and administration of the scholarships.

To be eligible... applicants must:

- be a member of the Catholic Church
- plan to attend a Catholic College or University.
- be average or above in academic achievement.
- be an active participant in school, church, and community activities.

• be a member of the current senior class of a Steele County High School.

• sons or daughters of Knights of Columbus or deceased Knights shall receive preference.

Each year, the Council Trustees review applications and select recipients. Currently the fund stands at \$26,576 as of January 1, 2016, and is supported by KC members through their voluntary donations in addition to their annual dues. Total voluntary collections from KC members for the William Warner Fund contributed in 2015 totaled \$1,141. These funds are invested and managed through "The Hartford" family of funds. Knights who would like more information about the scholarship fund, the candidates, or the process of selecting recipients are welcome to contact any of the trustees.

Did You Know?

The Knights of Columbus set a new all-time record last year for charitable donations and service hours with \$175,079,192 in donations and more than 73.5 million hours of service. The numbers were announced at the closing session of the annual Organizational Meeting of State Deputies in New Haven.

Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson and his wife, Dorian, attended the 6th Poland State Convention which took place April 22-24, 2016 in Lomza, Poland. Located northeast of the capital city of Warsaw, Lomza was one of the original six cities where the first Knights of Columbus councils were established in 2006. This year's State Convention coincides with the 10th anniversary of the first ceremonial exemplifications that established the Order of the Knights of Columbus in Poland.

In 2010, Council 8157 formally established Knight Hands as a way for members to help parishioners in need at Holy Spirit Catholic Church, where the council is based. If they needed assistance, parishioners were asked to fill out an application. Then, pending review and approval by the Knight Hands' advisory board, a team would then be sent to the worksite to get the job done - at no cost to the client.


