Chaplain's Message by Rev. James Starasinich

Dear Brother Knights,

Lent is upon us, beginning later this year with Ash Wednesday on March 6. Lent is a moment of grace and not a season of dreariness or drudgery because of the call to do penance. It is actually a call to conversion, to redirect our lives to God by reflecting on our relationship with Jesus. As members of the Body of Christ, the Church, we speak of being on a way of ongoing conversion. Our human nature seeks comfort, consolation, and rest from the demands that work and the challenges of life bring upon us. St. Paul helps us when he speaks about Jesus: "For Jews demand signs and Greeks look for wisdom, but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those whom are called, Jews and Greeks alike, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For the foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength." (1 Corinthians 1:22-25)

The crucified Savior, through the cross, brought salvation and Jesus himself invites us, as his disciples, to take up our cross daily if we want to be his followers, and thus true disciples. The cross represents all that does not go according to our plans. We all have good intentions, but life does not always go the way we would like. The cross of illness, being unemployed,

an overbearing boss, difficult relationships, or whatever causes some type of suffering in our lives is to be embraced with faith. It is the way of the cross that leads to salvation. The Church helps us this Lent through the exercises of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. These three weapons enable us to draw nearer to God through more frequent communication (prayer); getting rid of or abstaining from things that are not really important for our lives (fasting – and not only from food and drink but things like the computer, television, hobbies, etc. Origin, an ancient Christian writer of the Church, put it simply: Fast from sin!); and relying on Providence through charity (almsgiving – remembering the words of St Paul: "Those who want to be rich are falling into temptation and into a trap and into many foolish and harmful desires, which plunge them into ruin and destruction. For the love of money is the root of all evils, and some people in their desire for it have strayed from the faith and have pierced themselves with many pains.") (1 Timothy 6:9-10) Let us take up these weapons this Lent and fight the good fight of faith!

A happy and holy Lenten season to all!
