CELEBRATION OF LIFE AND SERVICE - APRIL 7

For those Brother Knights and family members who were able to attend our Celebration of Life and Service on April 7th, our annual Council 945 awards banquet, Brother Knight Matt Birk, Former Viking, 6-time Pro Bowl Center and 2011 Walter Payton Man of the Year Award Winner and oh, yeah, Superbowl Champion with the Baltimore Ravens, helped us appreciate what it takes to do great things. Matt shared how winning the big game really was just doing what he and his team had been practicing every day for all the years of his 15-year NFL career. Those of us who played football related to how taking every step, keeping a wide base and keeping your head down in football really were like practicing the fundamental aspects of our Faith. Matt explained that one of the things he likes most about his Faith is the deeply rooted basic things that Catholics do all the time. Attending Mass, Adoration, and Prayer are things you can do every day, every week, over and over and like football, they build to something so much bigger than just us. Like many of us, Matt re-invigorated his faith around the time he was married and he and his wife Adrianne welcomed their first child. Matt became involved with the Pro-life movement increasingly, claiming he had learned that he could not say, "no," to a request from a Priest. Father Sauer and Father Stephen were on hand and may have jotted down a note at that point! After explaining why and how he had become involved in supporting the Pro-Life movement to his kids, Matt made the choice to decline the traditional invitation to the White House after winning the Superbowl because of comments from the President in support of Planned Parenthood that did not sync with Matt's Catholic Faith. It seemed like the story about how Matt became a Knight was a page out of the Lavern Klecker playbook, when he was asked, "Why wouldn't you become a Knight?" Matt's talk was relatable, genuine, and really challenged us to continue to do the fundamental little things that build to accomplishing Great things, something we see with our Council every year!

We had six Brother Knights sponsor Matt speaking at the Banquet and our State Programs Director was impressed that we were able have such a good banquet and also raise over \$2,000 for Culture of Life activities, in addition to donating \$2,000 to the Wakota Life Center on behalf of the Council and Matt Birk. Past Grand Knights donated generous silent auction baskets and several people pitched in to help prepare and serve food, set up the event, and participate in many ways.
