Benefits Corner by Kevin Gallagher

It is becoming evident to me and to many others that we are in the midst of change which will be new to the vast majority of us. I do not have a crystal ball or the “smarts” to predict what the future holds. However...virtually everything I read (and I am careful of what I read) leads to this conclusion. A very recent article by an author whom I greatly respect concluded...“There is great danger ahead. The biggest bubble in history is about to pop and investors are racing toward that bubble rather than away from it”. He also made an interesting observation that 80% of the wealth is in the hands of those over 70...many who lived through the Great Depression and WWII. Why do they hold 80%? First and foremost, they learned to save and keep that money saved. (Note the word used is “saved” not “invested”.) And...they learned to live within their means and didn’t buy things they couldn’t afford or didn’t need.

The vast majority of us are ill-prepared for what lies ahead. In a recent article, I referred to the amount of money the typical person will have accumulated and how long that will last. When you add the fact we’re living longer, for most it won’t be anywhere near enough. If you doubt the “great danger ahead,” consider that today many astute financial planners are advising we have 100% of our pre-retirement income in our retirement years. With very real predictions of higher inflation (the silent destroyer) and higher taxes this is probably good solid advice.

So...what should we do? I think the 70 plus folks know the answer. It’s really simple. We need to save more. For most, it won’t be easy. But, I can assure you this...it will be a whole lot easier saving more now than trying to live on less later.

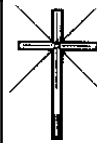

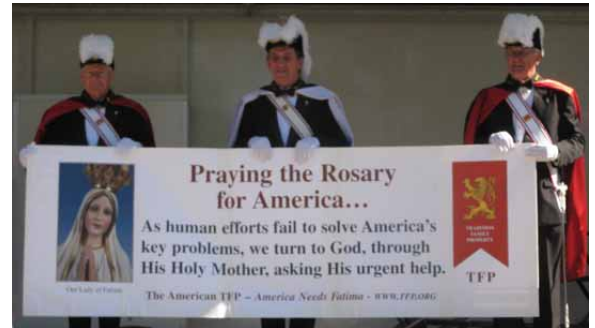
Everyone is invited to join the families of these Brother Knights as their memory is celebrated in this annual tradition.

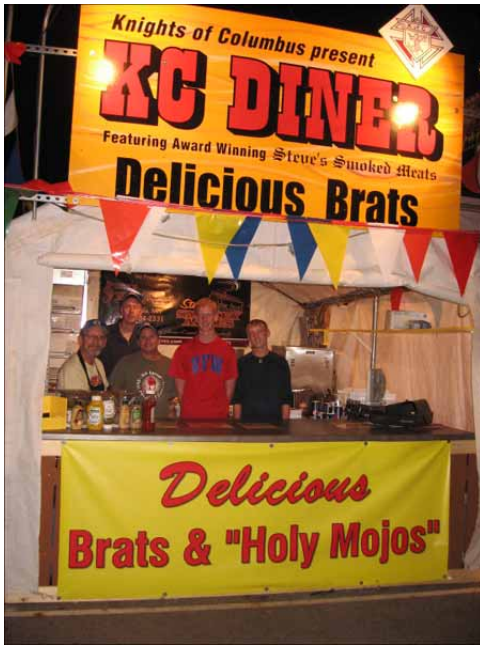

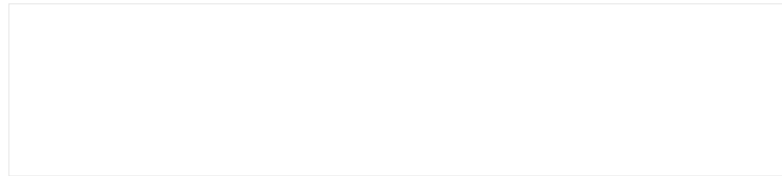
