Contributing to the campaign will ensure that our seminary will continue to be a top-notch place in which today's priests are formed in Christ's image so they can one day offer their service to God's people.

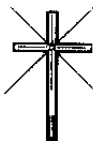
The campaign will also assist our parishes in spreading the Gospel message of Jesus Christ which is so needed in today's world.

The title of this article is the phrase that appears on the masthead of Council 945's newsletter *The Key*.

This past spring the Council received the first place service award for public relations. This is a competition that councils from across the state of Minnesota submit entries to the State Council for judging. A large part of the judging criteria is the council's newsletter. We are pleased that *The Key* played a large role in garnering this award.

A newsletter of this quality doesn't just happen. It takes a great number of hours involving a large number of people to get it in the members' hands in a timely manner. There are two main objectives when publishing *The Key*; to provide information and to give recognition.

It all begins with a reminder email from Linda Elbert to the officers and directors for them to submit their articles or information by the middle of the month. Linda, wife of Brother Knight Joe Elbert, does the layout and composition of the newsletter. This deadline is necessary in order to have the newsletter laid out, proofread, printed, taped, folded and delivered to the U.S. Post Office. The goal is to have *The Key* in the member's mailbox on or before the first of the month.

Linda submits the preliminary copy of the newsletter to the grand knight, Nancy Janke, Tim Rice, and a few other brother knights. This preliminary copy is proofread for accuracy of details, spelling, and punctuation. These preliminary copies go back and forth several times until all corrections are made.

The final copy is then sent to Insty Prints where it is printed in its final form. It is now in the final stage before going in the mail. *The Key* folding crew meets to fold, tape, and label the newsletter and then it is sorted into five different mail trays. These trays are delivered to the Post Office ready for delivery to Brother Knights of Council 945.

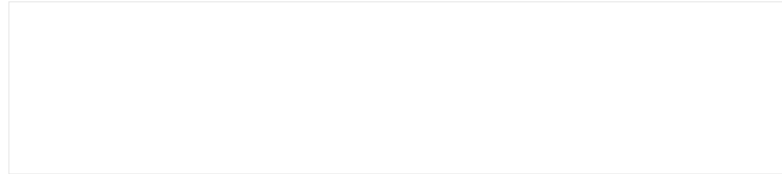
