Chaplain's Message by Rev. James Starasinich

Dear Brother Knights,

We continue to take precautions amidst the COVID-19 pandemic. St. John Eudes, who lived in France in the 17th century, risked his life to serve the sick during the plagues of 1627 and 1631. He was a young priest in those days and he lived in community with his order, the Oratorians. Thinking of the others also in his community, he lived in a field, in a wooden barrel, so that he would not infect his brother Oratorians while he served plague victims. The Holy Spirit moved him to do such a service and the saints throughout history risked their lives for the sake of others. This is true love, the same love that moves us today, to reach out to those in need and without counting the cost, even if it means giving one's life for the sake of another. This is how Christ has loved the world, giving His life on the cross so that we may have eternal life. May we, too, focus on what really matters most during this pandemic: our salvation and the salvation of others. The soon to be beatified, Venerable Father Michael J. McGivney, died at a young age. Recalling the biography written about Fr. McGivney, which I read some years ago, he also gave his life for others, dying of exhaustion as he gave his all to be there for his parishioners and for his Brother Knights. This inspires us to continue our mission as Knights, giving our lives for our families and local community and beyond, because the Spirit of God is alive in our hearts.
