Chaplain's Message by Rev. John Sauer

In late September, Pope Francis visited the United States and Cuba. The original reason for his visit was to take part in the World Meeting of Families which is held every several years. This year it was held in Philadelphia. Pope Francis often speaks of the joys and challenges that families face in our world today.

During his apostolic journey to the Philippines, he said, "Resting in prayer is especially important for families. It is in the family that we first learn how to pray. And don't forget when the family prays together, it remains together. This is important. There we come to know God, to grow into men and women of faith, to see ourselves as members of God's greater family, the Church. In the family we learn how to love, to forgive, to be generous and open, not closed and selfish. We learn to move beyond our own needs, to encounter others and share our lives with them. That is why it is so important to pray as a family! That is why families are so important in God's plan for the Church!"

Thank you for the ways that the Knights are supportive of our families. Your example as men of faith and as spiritual fathers within your families is so important today.

September is also the time when school begins. As you know, St. Mary's School and the Religious Education Program have been displaced due to structural issues with the St. Mary's building. Staff, teachers, parents, and the whole community came together to create an alternate site so that the children could be welcomed at the beginning of the year. All of this happened in just a few weeks. Some of the staff created a logo that says, "St. Mary's Strong." This summer has been proof of the truth of that statement.

At the present time, we are assessing the work that will need to be done. Once school came into session we turned our energy to the refurbishment of the building. We will continue to share information as it becomes available to us. We believe that all of the classroom floors will need to be reinforced. We are getting a formal opinion, but have been told that the gym and cafeteria are safe for continued use. Although we are fairly certain of the costs associated with the move itself, we are not yet sure of the scope and cost of the repairs. Once we have some good numbers on that, we will be conducting a campaign to pay for the move and the repairs.

There are lots of rumors swirling around out there. Please double check your facts before you pass on incorrect information. We want to be as transparent as possible, but require time to get information ourselves. Mary has been a wonderful patron for our school and religious education program. We turn to her in our time of need, confident in the efficacy of her prayers.

Raising Awareness About Life Insurance

Each September since 2003 has been designated as Life Insurance Awareness Month. Like most awareness-raising campaigns, Life Insurance Awareness Month was created because there is an overwhelming lack of understanding of life insurance, its uses, its benefits, and its variations among the general public. Each year, the Life Insurance Market Research Association (LIMRA) puts out the results from a recent survey, and unfortunately, the numbers they report continue to be discouraging.

A recent survey found that more than 75 percent of people polled did not have a personal financial advisor, even though 68 percent of them said their opinion of the current economic conditions was somewhat unfavorable or very unfavorable.

In other words, a majority of those surveyed were uncomfortable with the economy and the uncertainty it brings, yet they did not seek professional assistance. Maybe they spoke with their friends and family. Maybe they hoped the instability would go away on its own. Maybe they did not know to whom to turn.

If you fall into this category, please remember that as a member of the Knights of Columbus, you have a full-time, professional agent you can call your own.
