Chaplain's Message by Rev. Kevin Connolly

Two things I am exploring doing as chaplain is offering a Holy Hour for Men, sponsored by the Knights of Columbus. The Holy Hour would be a late Sunday afternoon and include Expositions of the Blessed Sacrament and Confessions. I am still working on this date. It would be open to all men of the parishes. Invite any man who might be interested in prayer and praying with other men.

The other program I want to have is a study group of men. One of the booklets we would use in Into the Breach written by the Bishop of Phoenix, AZ. In this document, he details how men need to step into the breach and provide leadership both physical and spiritual leadership to our families. Men need to be supported and nourished and find other men. This study group will begin, it may be early morning or evening. Stay tuned for more information about these events.

This is an excerpt from the Encyclical *Humanae Vitae*, promulgated on June 25, 1968. In this portion of the Encyclical Paul VI foresees 50 years ago what might happen if birth control and abortion become the law and the policy of societies. You might want to consider this in light of October being Respect Life month and how societies regard for life has become crude, coarse and rather unfeeling. You might want to reflect and see how these consequences affected families and marriages and the culture in your life during these last 50 years. Paul VI writes:

Consequences of Artificial Methods

17. Responsible men can become more deeply convinced of the truth of the doctrine laid down by the Church on this issue if they reflect on the consequences of methods and plans for artificial birth control. Let them first consider how easily this course of action could open wide the way for marital infidelity and a general lowering of moral standards. Not much experience is needed to be fully aware of human weakness and to understand that human beings—and especially the young, who are so exposed to temptation—need incentives to keep the moral law, and it is an evil thing to make it easy for them to break that law. Another effect that gives cause for alarm is that a man who grows accustomed to the use of contraceptive methods may forget the reverence due to a woman, and, disregarding her physical and emotional equilibrium, reduce her to being a mere instrument for the satisfaction of his own desires, no longer considering her as his partner whom he should surround with care and affection.

Finally, careful consideration should be given to the danger of this power passing into the hands of those public authorities who care little for the precepts of the moral law. Who will blame a government which in its attempt to resolve the problems affecting an entire country resorts to the same measures as are regarded as lawful by married people in the solution of a particular family difficulty? Who will prevent public authorities from favoring those contraceptive methods which they consider more effective? Should they regard this as necessary, they may even impose their use on everyone. It could well happen, therefore, that when people, either individually or in family or social life, experience the inherent difficulties of the divine law and are determined to avoid them, they may give into the hands of public authorities the power to intervene in the most personal and intimate responsibility of husband and wife.

Knight of the Month

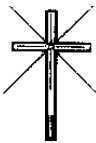


Rev. Kevin Connolly

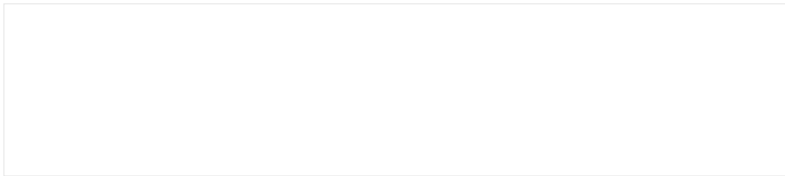
